Wheat Crop For Year Placed At 791,768,000 Bu.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 (AP)—The indicated total wheat crop, this year, winter and spring combined, is placed at 791,768,000 bushels by the department of agriculture, compared with 786,000,000 last month and 902,000,000 last year. Durum wheat production is indicated at 51,678,000 bushels, against 53,000,000 last month and 93,000,000 last year, with all other spring wheat indicated at 13,157,000 bushels, against 164,000,000 last month and 231,000,000 last year. Indicated production of other crops was announced as: winter wheat, 512,000,000 bushels, Rye, 41,000,000, Buckwheat, 11,700,000, Flaxseed, 16,600,000, Hay (tame) 100,000,000 tons, Apples, 46.2, Potatoes 48.7.

LOGGING OPERATIONS

ASTORIA, Ore., Oct. 11 (AP)—Logging operations in Clatsop county during the past assessment year resulted in the removal of 790,215,000 feet of timber.

Renews Interest In Mystery. Conflict of opinion on the peculiar wiping out of a party of Stefansson, polar explorers has been brought about through "The Great White North," the motion picture record, recalling what happened to them, which has been released

by the Fox Film corporation and is to open today at the Colonial theater. This party separated from VII-Hunt Stefansson's expedition in 1912 when their ship, the Karfik, foundered in the ice. The party of four hoped to reach land by a shorter route than that taken by the rest of the expedition. Not until ten years later was their fate discovered by Sidney Snow at the head of a camera expedition into the Polar wastes. The camp and its equipment with the skeletons of the men were located on the shores of Herald Island. Near the remains of the men, most of whom were found in bed with the canvas of their tents about them, were several guns, many unopened cans of concentrated food, a stove and other supplies. The dramatic manner of the finding of these things is shown in the picture.
