Van Dine's Story Makes Thrilling Film

"The Greene Murder Case" was a great murder mystery story told as a moving picture film it appeared in film form at the Arcade theater yesterday. It is even more gripping, more exciting. The reason for this can be ascribed to the intelligent character portrayals furnished by the actors and the excellent direction of Frank Tuttle.

The plot has to do with the strange killings which occur in the Greene family's household. An older son, his younger brother and then their mother succumb to the fiendish hand of an unknown murderer.

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By Williams Wayward Scion, Now 'Good Boy', Seeks Fortune

ST. LOUIS (AP)—A divorcee he obtained in 1924 may cost Vincent Kerens \$1,500,000 inherited from his father's estate by virtue of five years of "sobriety and good behavior."

The issue, involving the Catholic church law against divorce, is to be decided in federal court here this fall.

Kerens, the son of Richard V. Kerens, St. Louis railroad magnate and one-time ambassador to Austria-Hungary, once was a dashing figure in St. Louis society. Now his attorneys claim he has been a "good boy" long enough.

The will of his father, who died 12 years ago, provided Vincent should receive one-third of a \$7,500,000 estate upon completing "five consecutive years of continued sobriety and good behavior." Two sisters and another brother were the other beneficiaries.

For a time the younger Kerens continued his escapades in efforts to break the will. Becoming a soldier of fortune, he served in the aviation corps during the world war, later joining the British army. Sent to Siberia, he was decorated for valor three times.

At home Kerens set out to meet requirements of the will. He entered the brokerage business in Texas and "walked the straight and narrow," according to affidavits.

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Officers of the St. Louis Union Trust company, still trustees of his

inheritance, last year decided he had earned his share as specified. They took steps to end the trust- ship. Then Kerens' past rose as an obstacle.

His sisters, Mrs. Madeline Knott of New York and London, and Mrs. Gladys Colket of Philadelphia, stated in an interesting action that he had violated the Roman Catholic church law by divorcing his first wife and later re-marrying.

Their petitions referred to Vincent's divorce from Mrs. Jane Henry Kerens, whom he had married amid social pomp in 1909. He had shown bad faith, they contended, in going to an "obscure Texas county" to bring the action.

The sisters, beneficiaries in event of Vincent's death, also said they were not represented before directors of the trust company at a hearing when it was decided to terminate the trustship.

The whole affair has been set for trial before Judge Charles E. Harris of the federal court. Kerens now is 52 years old.
