Over the Valley
Special Session
State Grange
Saturday Oct. 26

The special session of the Oregon State Grange which is to be held in La Grande on Saturday, October 26, and which will attract members of the order from all of Eastern Oregon, promises to be the largest gathering of farm folks ever held in this county. Numerous committees are at work attending to necessary preliminary arrangements for the busy session, that all the events of the day may be taken care of in the smoothest manner possible.
The morning conference will be held in the La Grande high school starting at about ten o'clock in the morning. All the sessions will be held there up to the time of the banquet in the evening. That will be staged at the L. O. O. F. hall, with the Union county chamber of commerce cooperating. The degree work will be put on in the evening at the high school gymnasium.
Some eight counties will participate in the gathering, and the different subordinate organizations from these counties will assist in putting on different features of the day's work. Mrs. L. E. Bailey of Baker, assisted by a committee of Pendleton farmers will have charge of the lectures; conference; Mrs. Charles Hook, chairman of the home economics department will have charge of the home economics conference; W. R. Gekeler, district director will conduct the conference for insurance agents; Mrs. Miles Woodard and Mrs. W. R. Gekeler will have charge of the juvenile work, and the state master, George Palmer, will conduct a conference for masters and deputies.
L. E. Bailey of Baker and Charles Nizer of La Grande are to assist the reception committee members and the home economics committee of the county is to cooperate with other groups in staging the banquet in the evening.
Grange members in this county and adjoining counties are quite enthusiastic over the coming of grange members in such large numbers as will doubtless be the case on this occasion. Two sectional meetings are being held prior to the big national convention which opens next month at Seattle, Washington. La Grande will care for the eastern sectional meeting in fine shape, it is believed.

BULGARIANS WANT CIVIL
MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE
SOFIA (AP)—Bulgarians are being made to introduce laws permitting civil marriage and divorce in Bulgaria. Since early times both the uniting of couples in wedlock and the dissolution of the unions have been in the hands of the clergy of all sects, the courts having nothing to say in such matters.
A recent congress of the Union of Lawyers adopted a resolution declaring this system antiquated. Since then the Synod of the Orthodox church has instructed its clergy to preach against civil marriage and has announced that the discipline of the church will be used against those who advocate the changes proposed by the lawyers.

WARSAW (AP)—The problem of attracting tourists to Japan and Egypt, as well as to European countries, was discussed at the International Tourist Congress here. The congress ordered a special film depicting the beauties of European tourist centers and giving information about transportation, for distribution in the United States.
