SUMMONS IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR UNION COUNTY

State of Oregon, represented and acting by L. E. Patterson, Governor; Hal E. Howe, Secretary of State; George A. White, Adjutant General; Edward P. Bailey and W. C. North, comprising the World War Veterans State Aid Commission of the State of Oregon, Plaintiff.

Defendants: Fred Murray, Golda B. Murray, his wife, G. P. Hall and Percy Litter.

You are hereby required to appear and answer the amended complaint filed against you in the above entitled case on or before the 5th day of November, 1929, the said date being the last day of the four weeks period prescribed by the order for the publication of this summons.

And if you fail to answer said amended complaint or otherwise plead herein, for want thereof, the above named plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief prayed for in its complaint, to-wit:

For judgment and decree against the defendant, Fred Murray, for the sum of \$226.55, together with interest thereon at the rate of 4% per annum from the 22nd day of May, 1925, until paid, for the further sum of \$239.90, reasonable attorney fees for the collection of plaintiff's note and the foreclosure of plaintiff's mortgage and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements incurred herein.

That plaintiff's mortgage given to secure said note as heretofore described be decreed to be a first and prior lien over all other liens or encumbrances and that the said sums of money above set forth be decreed to be a good, valid, and subsisting lien upon the said premises under and by virtue of the said mortgage, upon all of the property heretofore described and as described in plaintiff's mortgage, to-wit:

Commencing one thousand two hundred nineteen and six-tenths (1219.6) feet North of center of Section thirteen (13), Township Four (4) South, Range thirty-nine (39) East of Willamette Meridian County of Union, State of Oregon; thence North three hundred thirty-seven and forty-eight one-hundred-thirtieth (337.48) feet; thence West two thousand five hundred eighty-one and five-tenths (2581.5) feet; thence South three hundred thirty-seven and forty-eight one-hundred-thirtieth (337.48) feet; thence East two thousand five hundred eighty-one and five-tenths (2581.5) feet to the place of beginning containing twenty (20) acres, more or less, in the County of Union, State of Oregon.

and that the said mortgage be foreclosed, and that the property therein described be sold as provided by law; that the plaintiff may be a purchaser at said sale; that the proceeds of the said sale of the said property be applied to the payment of the amounts due the plaintiff and to become due upon the promissory note heretofore described, reasonable attorney fees and costs and disbursements of this suit, and accruing costs, and if the proceeds of the said sale are not sufficient to pay the said sums due the plaintiff, and to become due as aforesaid, then the same to be applied pro tanto upon the amount due and to become due the plaintiff; that the sheriff, at the time of the said sale of the mortgaged property, put the purchaser of said property in possession thereof; that the sheriff be directed to execute and deliver to said purchaser, at the time of said sale, a certificate of sale to said property and a sheriff's deed to the same at the expiration of the time allowed by law for the redemption of real property, if no redemption be had.

That the equity of the defendants, Golda B. Murray, G. P. Hall and Percy Litter, and all persons claiming under them, in and to said mortgaged property be forever barred and foreclosed of and from all right, title, estate or interest in and to or upon said mortgaged property; and every part thereof, saving and excepting only the statutory right of redemption.

That the said mortgage be declared to be prior in time and superior in right to any right, title or interest, or any claim of any right, title, estate or interest which the defendants, Golda B. Murray, G. P. Hall or Percy Litter, or any of them may have or claim to have in or to or upon said premises or any part thereof, and that the defendants, and each of them and all persons or parties claiming under them, or any of them, may be forever enjoined and barred

from asserting any claim whatsoever in and to said land and premises adverse to plaintiff, and for such other and further relief as to the Court may seem just and equitable.

GOVERNMENT NURSERIES WORRY GROWERS OF TREES

WORTON (AP)—A danger to nurserymen in the form of government competition was foreseen by E. C. Hillborn of Valley City, N. D., a speaker at the convention of the American Association of Nurserymen here.

Nurserymen, asserted Mr. Hillborn, were caught unaware when the Clark-McNary bill was enacted. "This act provides for raising trees for use on government property," he explained. "But it also provides that the surplus may be sold or otherwise distributed. There may be few customers for young trees when they can be obtained from the government free."

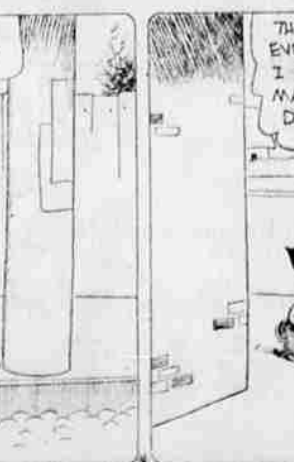
