THREE LEFT IN EAST ORE. RACE

La Grande, Milton-Free-water, Baker Remain in Winning Column

With three teams remaining undefeated in Eastern Oregon the high school football season will enter the semi-finals this coming weekend, with La Grande (winner of the 25-yard line) and Baker, unless a tie develops, when next Sunday rolls around, there will be two undefeated teams remaining—the winner at Baker and the McLaughlin high school eleven of Milton-Free-water.

Baker showed a waiting world that her team has strength, by subduing the Boise, Idaho, team 19 to 0. Although this didn't count in Eastern Oregon circles, it threw a man-sized score into La Grande, McLaughlin and the rest.

La Grande had the narrowest escape, barely nosing out Enterprise by a touchdown. The Tigers, with games yet with Baker, Blue Hill and Pendleton, have the most promising schedule of the three undefeated eleven, and victory for the blue and white in all three games would be a distinct upset of the dope.

Incidentally, with the defeat of two more Idaho eleven Saturday, Oregon kept its state clean for the year. It all started on when Ontario trimmed Caldwell 9 to 0. Then the Eastern Oregon Normal school defeated the College of Idaho 13 to 7 and La Grande won from Nampa 7 to 0. Boise bowed to Baker and Idaho lost to Portland, 14 to 7.

Idaho will have its last chance this coming Saturday, when Idaho plays Oregon State at Corvallis and Eastern Oregon Normal school journeys to the Gem state to play the Lewiston Normal school.
