## MENUS

**By Sister Mary**

An excellent ice-cream dessert for children that is festive enough to take the place of ice cream for a birthday party is found in "Graham Cracker Roll—Supreme."

Each slice can be decorated with birthday candles. Each small guest in turn blows out the candles on his dessert and makes a wish for the small host or hostess.

The dessert is not too rich and has the advantage of being prepared the day before wanted. It also answers for both ice cream and cake.

**Graham Cracker Roll**  
One pound graham crackers, 1 pound dates, 1/2 pound marshmallows, 1 cup white meats, cream.

Wash and stone dates. Any kind of nuts except peanuts can be used. Put crackers, dates, nuts and marshmallows through the food chopper, alternating the ingredients to prevent chopper from becoming clogged. Turn into a large mixing bowl and work with a wooden spoon, adding cream to make mixture moist enough to hold together. Shape it to a roll about three and one-half inches in diameter and put on a platter. Put in refrigerator to chill and become firm. Allow at least 12 hours for

the roll to chill. Cut in slices about one-half inch thick and serve with a garnish of whipped cream. Dates are a natural sweet, perfectly harmless for children. Since the nuts are very finely chopped, there is practically no danger of their being indigestible for children. Graham crackers are the children's "own" and marshmallows are a pleasant confection. Cream is one of the most easily digested mix. So taking the roll in whole or in part, it's an ideal dessert for children as young as five years of age.

## Caution Needed During Fall, Is Word to Drivers

DETROIT, Oct. 24—Fall, the season of beautiful foliage enlivening the country side with picturesque scenery hued in all the shades of yellows, browns, reds and tans, brings with it a message that should spell caution to the motoring public, it is said. It is nature's signal of the approaching rest period and precedes the dropping of the leaves which are pushed from the stems as the succeeding buds set preparatory to their reign in the spring.

As these leaves fall and cover the roads they make for more difficult driving for all but those who are prepared by a proper knowledge of correct use of their car brakes under any condition.

Hudson Motor Car Company engineers, who have established the precedent of carrying on their experimental tests under actual driving conditions, have made an exhaustive series of tests to determine correct brake operation when driving over wet fallen leaves. The instructions that they have issued on correct brake operation during the fall while the leaves are on the ground are of interest to all drivers.

"This fall when approaching a stretch of highway covered with fallen leaves, the brakes should be applied gently to prevent skidding. Leave the clutch engaged so that the motor will continue to turn the rear wheels sufficiently to maintain the forward motion of the car. As the brakes begin to slow the car down, increase the pressure gradually and release the clutch just before coming to a full stop. A leaf covered stretch of highway will often present a situation to even the most careful

"If these instructions are followed the chance of side slipping or skidding will be reduced to a minimum. The action of leaving the clutch engaged keeps the car moving forward enough to prevent the leaves from piling up in front of the wheels, which happens when the wheels are locked."
