State of Oregon, represented and acting by I. L. Patterson, Governor, Hal E. Hoss, Secretary of State, George A. White, Adjutant General, Edwards F. Bailey and W. C. North, comprising "the World War Veterans' State Aid Commission of the State of Oregon," Plaintiff

vs.

Fred Murray, Golda B. Murray,

and forty-eight one hundredths (47.48) feet; thence East two thousand five hundred eighty-one and five-tenths (2581.5) feet to the place of beginning containing twenty (20) acres, more or less, in the County of Union, State of Oregon,

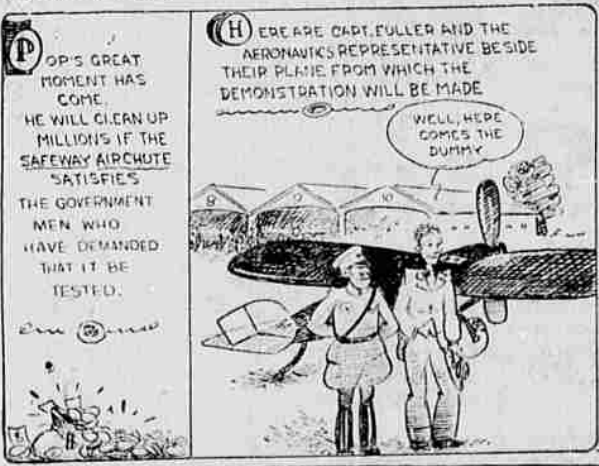

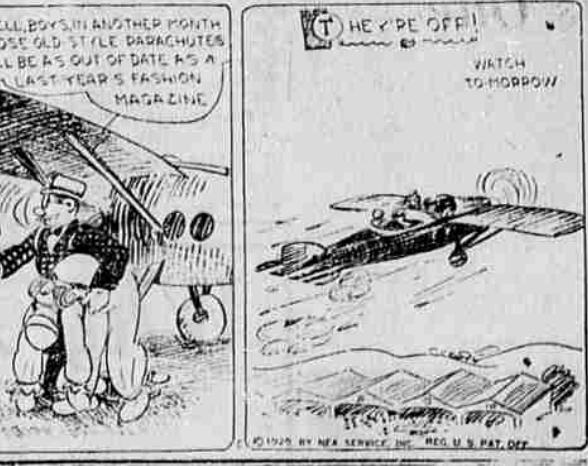
