Churches Unite Sunday Night In Armistice Meet

"World Peace" to be Theme of Union Service — Ex-Governor Pierce Will Speak.

At 7:30 p. m. Sunday evening the churches of the city will assemble at the Presbyterian church to commemorate the signing of the Armistice, to pay their respects to the men who have given their lives for their country and to think on means of ending war for all times.

Ex-Gov. Walter Pierce, who is the principal speaker, his subject will be "World Peace." Miss Mary P. Finley, of the National Council for the Prevention of War, will be present and will state briefly what her organization is doing.

Mrs. Harley Richardson will preside at the organ. The Presbyterian quartet will render "Awake My Soul," an anthem by Fred Hillard.

The American Legion and the Rotary club are to attend.

The Rev. M. G. Tompason, rector of St. Peter's Episcopal church, will preside as chairman of the ministerial association committee on international peace and he will be assisted by the other members of the committee. The Rev. L. J. Aves, of the English Lutheran church, the Rev. V. E. Hall, of the First M. E. church, as well

as by the Presbyterian pastor, the Rev. J. George Walz.

The service will be the feature event of Sunday's worship in La Grande.

Church announcements follow:

First M. E. Church
Interest and attention in the Sunday school at the First M. E. church is increasing and the pastor urges those who attend Sunday school, stay for the worship hour. The subject for next Sunday morning is "Jesus, On giving a Party."

Because of Armistice Sunday union services there will be no evening preaching service. The Epworth League will meet for its devotional service at the usual time, 8:20 o'clock.

First Presbyterian Church
At the 11:00 o'clock hour the pastor, the Rev. J. George Walz, will speak on "Life an Inscription on a Cross." To save youth for Christ is the noblest task to which the church can apply itself, said the pastor, and this theme will stress the attitude youth should take toward the Christ. Mrs. Harley H. Richardson, organist, will play the prelude "Nature's Lullaby" by Carl Kern, offertory "Meditation" by Charles Huebner, and a postlude. The quartet will sing the beautiful anthem "Thine, O Lord, is the Greatness" by Baltes.

This congregation will join with others of the city in the union service, at this church, in the interests of Armistice day, with a service that will appeal to all lovers of peace and prosperity. The service hour is 7:30, with ex-Governor Walter Pierce as speaker.

Mrs. Harley Richardson will play the service and the quartet.

Church of Nazarene
This evening will open the evangelistic meetings with the Rev. Harry Elliott, of Nampa, at the church of the Nazarene. These meetings will open to the people of La Grande the opportunity of hearing the gospel, preached in purity and power. The Rev. G. E. Sharp announces, "However, one will not get the best out of them if many are missed."

Sunday services will be at the usual hours: Sunday school at 9:45, preaching at 11, Mrs. Elliott bringing the message: N. Y. P. S. at 5:30 p. m. and the evening preaching at 7:30. All are invited to attend.

Baptist Church
There will be no preaching service at the Baptist church Sunday evening as the pastor and congregation will take part in the union Armistice day service at the Presbyterian church. The subject of the morning sermon will be "New Testament Stewardship." The B. Y. P. U. meeting will be at 4:30, Bible school at 9:45, morning preaching service at 11:00. Prayer meeting will be held Thursday evening at 7:30. A cordial welcome at these services is extended by the pastor.

Mrs. S. B. Morgan will sing a solo at the Sunday morning service, entitled "Behold What Manner of Love," by McDermaid. Mrs. Morgan will be accompanied by Miss Gladys Miller.

English Lutheran Church
The pastor will deliver the final sermon Sunday morning at the English Lutheran church on the series "Religion and Health," the special subject being "Worship and Health."
