In addition the waterway fund will be increased by a sum of between \$10,000,000 and \$5,000,000 available for Ohio river improvement work, which will not be needed for several years.

The fiscal year, but if congress improves, intends to recommend making the deficiency available in a sixth year, or in other words, the year after the coming fiscal period.

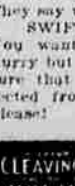
