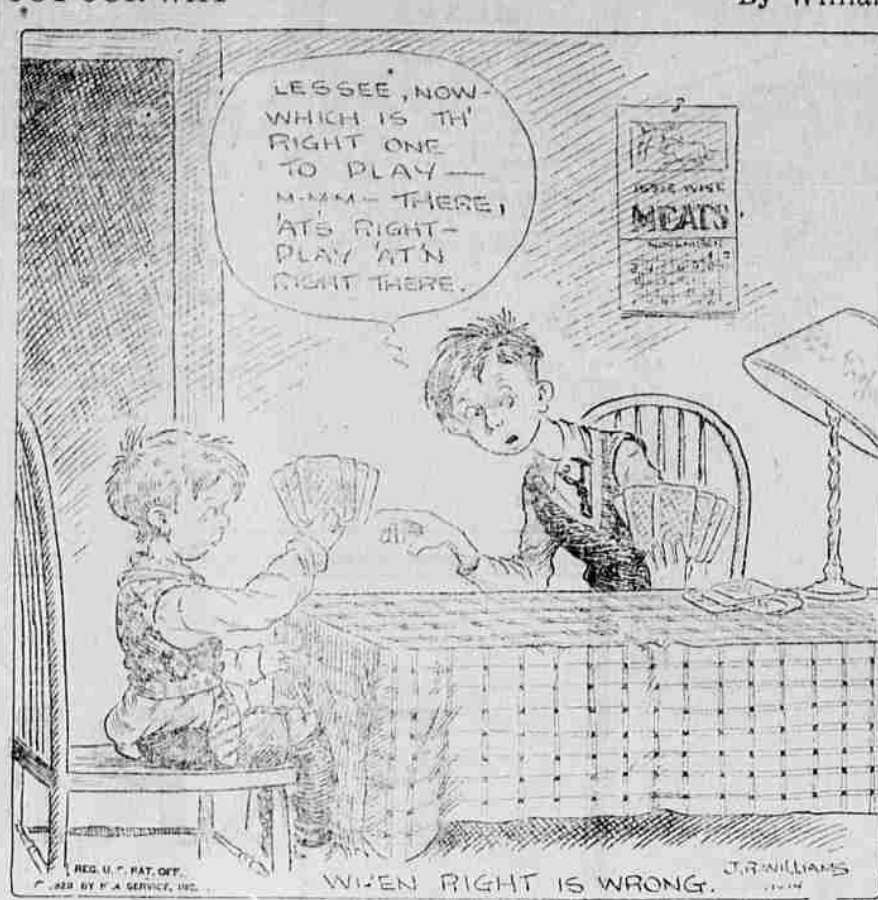
Nightingales

The word was originally applied to rows of niches in the walls of sepulchral chambers in Roman burial places from their fanciful resemblance to the dovecote. Eventually the name was applied to the chamber itself; hence its use at the present time.

Unworthy Christians
