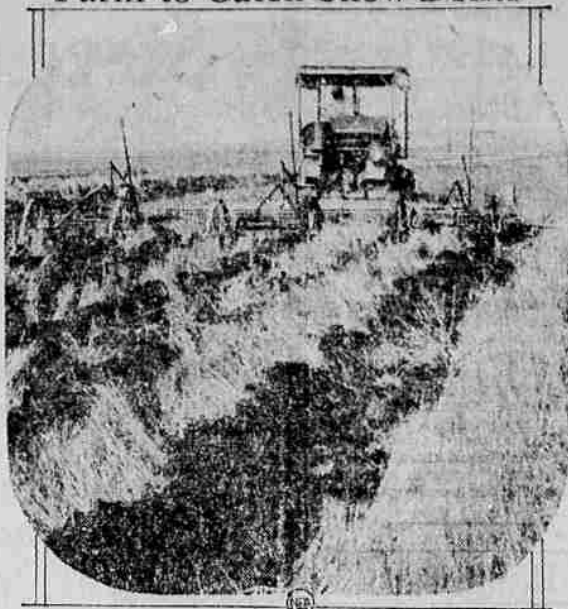

Farm to Catch Snow Drifts



On the flat farming land of Kansas, two problems confront farmers. Moisture conservation is one, and keeping the soil from drifting after being disked or listed is the other. The disked soil bogs, the moisture, but it is drifted by the wind which reaches high velocity during certain seasons. The problem has been solved by the Kansas State Agricultural Experimental farm at Hays, as shown above. After the disk, stubble is left projecting above the ground. This catches loose drifting soil and flying snow in the winter. The soil drift is checked and the melting snow yields valuable water to be stored up for a dry period.
