Butter Prices Go Down Cent Today

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 14 (AP)—Butter and butterfat prices underwent a 1-cent general decline at the Portland produce exchange today. Extras were quoted at 45c, standards at 44c, and prime firsts at 43c. Firsts remained at 35c. Butterfat dropped to 44c station. 45a track and 47c delivered Portland.

Egg prices were firm and unchanged. The fruit and vegetable situation was unchanged. Frosts have probably put an end to further maturing of garden products in the Portland area, with the exception of carrots, turnips and the like, and with California supplying the market, prices are expected to remain high.

Stocks Move Up In Wall Street; Sales 5,569,360

NEW YORK, Nov. 14 (AP)—Wall street case aside its mantle of gloom today as prices of leading securities rallied \$2 to \$20 a share and closed higher at the top. It was the first sustained rally after a week of destructive liquidation which has wiped out billions of dollars in quoted values, and sent scores of stocks to prices which represented only a small fraction of their year's high levels.

Total sales on the New York stock exchange for the abbreviated session were 5,569,360 shares, compared with 7,761,459 shares yesterday. Total sales on the New York carb exchange were 2,287,500 shares, as against 2,779,650 yesterday. The New York stock exchange ticker closed at 2:35 p. m., more than an hour and a half after trading had stopped on the floor of the exchange.

Wheat Unsettled At Closing Today

CHICAGO, Nov. 14 (AP)—Higher prices for wheat went hand in hand early today with stock market gains and with upturns in wheat quotations at Liverpool. Word of fairly good sized export business in North American wheat tended also to lift wheat values. Opening at 1/2 to 1 1/2 advance, Chicago wheat later held near the initial figures. Corn, oats and provisions were likewise stronger, with corn starting 1/2 to 1/4 up, and continuing firm. Wheat closed unsettled 1/2 to 1 1/2 a bushel higher than yesterday's finish. Corn closed 3/4 to 1/2 up; oats, 1/4 to 1/2 up; advance, and provisions ranging from 1/2 decline to a rise of 2/3.

Orange Eleven Preparing For Saturday's War

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis, Nov. 14—The lull before the storm which has its culmination when Oregon State meets Oregon at Eugene Saturday, has caused considerable interest and everyone is speculating as to the probable result of the "civil war" classic between the Orange and Lemon-Yellow. While the game will have no bearing on the conference titular honors it is expected that it will provide plenty of

thrills for the fans as this "raw meat" battle has in previous years. This tension was considerably increased when the rooks won a 7 to 6 skirmish with the Webfoot ducklings at Medford last Saturday. Excitement will be further stirred up when the rooks and fresh meet in their second "little big game" at Corvallis Friday. What is looked upon as a fitting opener for the weekend festivities with Captain John J. McEwan's Oregon eleven.

Oregon has a chance to tie Washington State for honors as the best team in the northern division of the Pacific coast conference if it wins from the Orange. The Lemon-Yellow has won from

Washington, 14 to 9; from Idaho, 34 to 7, to keep its northern slate clean. They also won 27 to 0 from UCLA to tie for fourth place with the Cougars. Oregon State is lodged in a tie for sixth place with Idaho's Vandals but have an opportunity to break this deadlock with a victory over their traditional friendly enemies.

Little or no "dope" has come from either of the campuses with relation to the starting lineups or the mode of attack to be used in the game. Schisler had everybody guessing when he indicated that he didn't care if it rained, while Captain McEwan announced that the Oregon team would employ a passing game against the Orange.

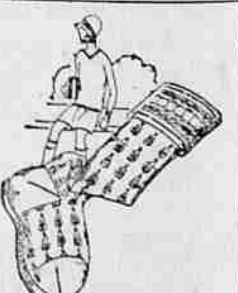
