TARIFF RATE ON CHERRIES IS INCREASED

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Amendments approved at the night session included increases in the tariff on fresh and sour cream from 20 to 26 1/2 cents a gallon as compared with the house rate of 45 cents; skimmed milk and buttermilk from 1 to 1 1/2 cents a pound; unsweetened condensed milk from 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 cents a pound; all other condensed milk from 1.25 to 2.50 cents a pound; dried whole milk from one to 6 1/2 cents a pound; dried cream from 7 to 12 1/2 cents a pound; dried skimmed milk and dried buttermilk from 1.5 to 3 cents a pound; and malted milk

Wheat Price Is Higher At Close Of Market Today

CHICAGO, Nov. 15 (AP)—Material fresh upturn in wheat values here took place early today, owing to Liverpool quotations being much higher than because of stock market advances. Word that black rust might reduce wheat yields in Argentina tended to promote speculative buying. Opening 1/2 to 1 1/2 higher, Chicago wheat afterward showed further gains. Corn, oats and provisions also were firmer, with corn starting 1/4 to 1/2 up, but subsequently reacting somewhat. Wheat closed 1/2 to 1 1/2 a bushel higher than yesterday's finish.

Even closed 1/2 to 1/2 down, oats 1/2 to 1/2 advance, and provisions unchanged to a rise of 1/2.

WOOL REPORT

BOSTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say:

"The week has been an exceedingly quiet one in all domestic wool markets. Some fall wools have been sold in Texas at 35 cents clean landed, Boston, but later bids are in the half-dollar level."

"The manufacturing position is considered healthy, although somewhat in suspense, due especially to continued mild weather."

"Foreign markets are buoyant. New Zealand opened a bit above previous levels. Low grades in Montevideo are higher. Bradford predicts a rise of 10 to 12 per cent on Merinos and 7 to 10 per cent on crossbreds at London Tuesday, over last sales closing rates."

"Mohair is dull with quotations hardly more than nominal."

STOMACH IS AFFECTED BY COLOR, CLAIM

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 15 (AP)—The physiology of color on the human anatomy was explained here today by J. E. Simmons, colorologist of Portland and Los Angeles in his address at the opening session of the Northwest Master Painters' association, to which about 150 from Oregon, Washington and British Columbia attended.

Simmons, who is an author of the book "Colorology," said that guinea pigs in the United States and convicts condemned to die in Germany were subjected to the constant effect of the color red and in both cases fermentation of the stomach followed.

Other complications resulted, Simmons said, but the outstanding development was the effect that color produced on the stomach.

NEW YORK, Nov. 15 (AP)—Heavy profit-taking swept over the New York stock exchange in the last half hour of trading today and carried scores of issues \$1 to \$10 below their earlier high levels, which ran as high as \$35 a share above yesterday's final quotations.

Profit-taking was particularly heavy in the case of the New York Central, which fell 10 points to \$110.
