

AUSTRALIA LIKES AMERICAN CARS

R. H. Bonney Again Is Named President—Talks Made.

Although everything pertaining to the United States arouses the keenest interest in Australia, the average American appears to be surprisingly uninformed about the great continent "down under."

"Sydney, the largest Australian city, with its population of 1,250,000, its railways, its harbor bridge which, when completed, will be the largest single span bridge in the world, is typically American in many respects."

"American enterprise is probably welcomed more heartily in the Antipodes than in any other part of the world, and the volume of Australian imports from this country has mounted steadily year after year until it now amounts to a tremendous figure."

"Practically 90 per cent of Australia's automobiles are of American manufacture. Although the population of Australia is only 5,500,000, its area is greater than that of the United States. It is a country of great distances and the typical low-powered European car is not suited to Australian requirements."

"Undoubtedly Australia is now entering a period of vast development. The whole commercial world realizes the increasing value of the Australian market and Europe is even now making every effort to control it."

Motor Vehicle Fees This Year At \$7,585,032

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 16 (AP)—Motor vehicle registrations for this year, January 1 to October 31, have brought in fees totaling \$7,585,032.89, says a statement from the secretary of state's office.

The total in fees received exceeds that for the whole 12 months of 1928 which was \$6,959,220.87. In 1928 a total of 232,493 passenger cars were registered.

Famous Explorers To Use American Cars In Fourth Trip Into Jungles

TOLEDO, O., Nov. 16 (AP)—Mr. and Mrs. Martin Johnson, noted African explorers, will this week aboard the Leylathian on their fourth expedition to Equatorial Africa. This trip is expected to be the most interesting and important of their African expeditions and will keep them away from the United States for about two years.

The explorers will head for Central Africa where, on the Victoria Nile, and in the Belgian Congo, are to be found the last unexplored parts of the world, a little known part of the world. In the Victoria-Nile region, an extremely tropical section, there are probably more crocodile and hippo than in any other place in the world, Mr. Johnson said.

"We have been particularly careful in selecting the right motor cars and trucks for our expedition," Mr. Johnson pointed out. CARBON MONOXIDE WARNING IS GIVEN

Urges Motorists to Take Utmost Precautions Against Gas.

Motorists should take the utmost precautions to protect themselves from the danger of carbon monoxide during the winter months, and the simplest is to never remain in a closed garage with the car running, according to J. E. Shelton, secretary-manager of the Oregon State Motor association, which is affiliated with the American Automobile association.

automobile running in an ordinary small garage with doors and windows closed will produce enough of the gas in a few minutes to cause death.

"The only safeguard is never to run the engine unless the garage door is open or at least two windows," he said.

The A. A. A. club executive said that while there are no definite figures available on the annual toll of deaths from carbon monoxide, the census bureau says there were 2378 deaths in 1923, while the number of automobiles has since nearly doubled.
