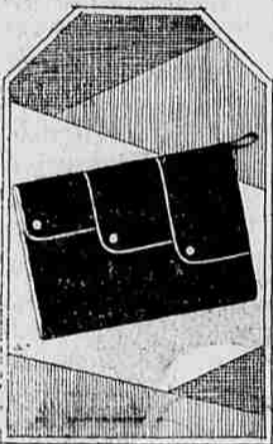

Health Talks

SAFEGUARDING THE MENTAL HEALTH OF THE PRE-SCHOOL CHILD

By Arnold Gesell, M. D. The hygiene of the child must begin with the protection of his physical growth. Nothing is more important than his nutrition, but he is a mental as well as a physical being from the moment he is

born. Mind and body grow together. Even in an infant we must begin to think about safeguarding mental health. The early years influence the mental stamina of later years. The mind grows. This growth cannot be measured by inches or pounds but it can always be estimated by the manner in which the child learns the art of living. This learning, with the help of father and mother, begins extremely early.

Nature unassisted never takes care of the details. The child must not only have the right kind of food, he must learn to eat the food in the right way (without undue fussing and fastidiousness). He must not only have the necessary hours of sleep, he must go to sleep in the right way. These are not purely physical matters. They are psychological. The beginnings of mental hygiene consist in good personal habits of eating, sleeping and

elimination, of play, of obedience and of social behavior. Parents can best protect the young child's mental health by keeping the parent-child relationship wholesome. The child needs affection, but he also needs good cheer and an increasing amount of parental detachment which will give him a chance to acquire self-reliance. His personality grows from day to day. We safeguard the father and mother are not barriers and balance of personal-

ity by respecting the psychological importance of everyday situations of life. Through praise rather than scolding, through encouragement rather than domination, through happiness rather than through failure, he learns self-confidence and good will. Thus he acquires a sense of values and a sense of security which even in very young children is the relationship of the father and mother are not barriers and balance of personal-

Nothing, therefore, is of more general importance for the early mental welfare of the child than the home atmosphere. Parents in their zeal may try too strenuously to shape the child into a preconceived pattern of their own. Guidance and growth are better methods. The child must achieve his own personality by increasing self-control and self-dependence. Parents may guide, but the child must do his own growing.

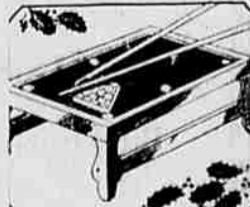

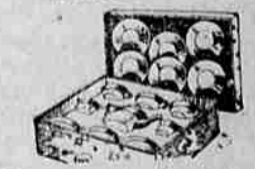

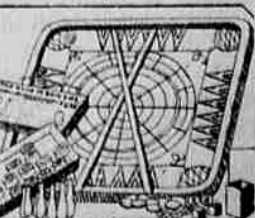
