

Willamette Wins From Whitman In Title Game, 40-13

WALLA WALLA, Wash., Nov. 28 (AP)—Coach Spore Keene's Willamette football squad is today champion of the Pacific northwest football conference by reason of their overwhelming defeat of Whitman college here yesterday, 40 to 13.

Panthers Take Eastern Title; Trim Penn State

NEW YORK, Nov. 29 (AP)—The mythical eastern football championship has fallen into the hands of Pittsburgh's mighty Panther army with Colgate only a step behind.

With big Tom Parkinson as a battering ram, the Panthers crunched their way through a strong and betting Penn State line yesterday to wind up their regular season unbeaten and untied in nine games.

So far as the records go, these two games were the standouts in an interesting and spectacular Thanksgiving day of football in which Penn surprised Cornell with a 17-7 win; Carnegie Tech ended the New York university jinx with a 29 to 0 victory, and Syracuse nosed out Columbia by a single touchdown, 6-0.

Washington High Victor Over Bend
PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 29 (AP)—Powerful machine like line plunging, intemperate with snarling attacks forced the Bend high school football team to relinquish any claim to the Oregon state interscholastic championship here yesterday by a smashing victory of 29 to 14.

Although the score bespeaks a rugged brand of football, it was by no means less than a variety of brilliant playing. Before 13,500 fans, Bend team finally found itself and staged a sensational counter attack that nearly averted defeat.

Pioneer Air Flight
The Bremen was the first airplane to make a non-stop flight from Europe to North America. Buying Hay In Wallowa County For West Oregon

ENTERPRISE Ore., Nov. 29 (Special)—While hay is reported short in many districts of the west, a buyer has been here this week to buy 1500 tons of the surplus crop of the valley. Nobody knows whether the valley has a surplus or faces a shortage, and nobody will know until grass is green next spring, according to the Enterprise Record-Chiefman. Stockmen hate to see hay go out, as they may need it, but they are not buying any themselves and they do not complain if farmers sell to those who are buying. "We have plenty of hay if the weather keeps open until New Year's and winter is not severe and long, and other stock owners are in the same position. But if the winter should be like that last year we would need some more feed. We have not bought more because we did not want to tie up the money and we thought it all right to take the chance. Under these circumstances we cannot ask the farmer to hold his hay until spring to see if we want it."

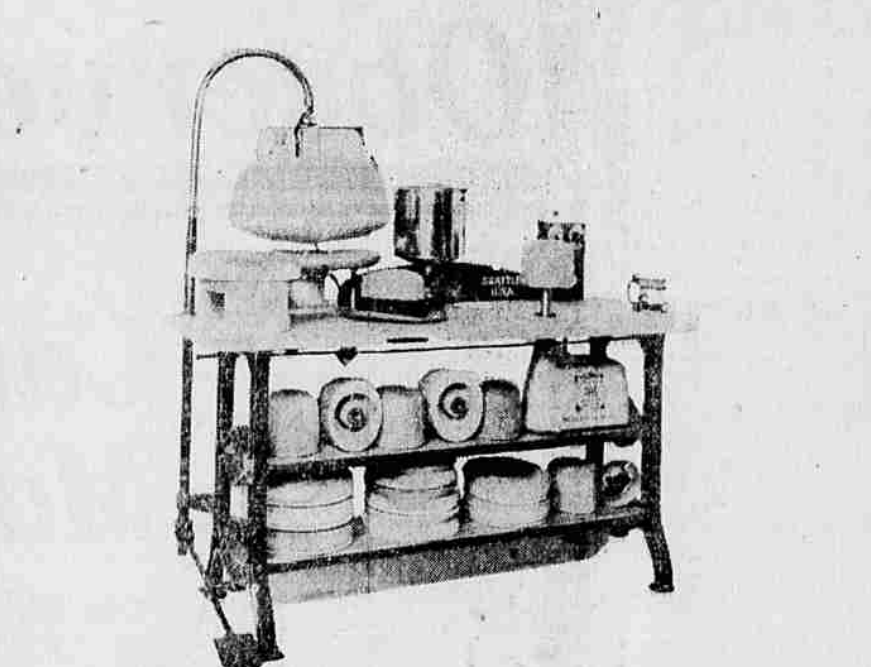
