Hoquiam Supports Loop Travel Move

HOQUIAM, Wash., (AP)—The proposed formation of a Northwest Coast Empire association for the purpose of developing loop travel along the Oregon and Washington coasts and the Pacific highway will receive the support of Hoquiam.
