FAVORS EQUALIZATION ON FEE

(CHICAGO, Dec. 10 (AP)—Former Governor Frank O. Lowden of Illinois reiterated today his belief in the principle of the equalization fee in the disposition of crop surpluses.

In an address before the convention of the American farm bureau federation, the agricultural leader urged farmers to join cooperative associations and support the federal farm board, but insert a word in behalf of the fee abandoned by the farm bureau last year after long advocacy.
