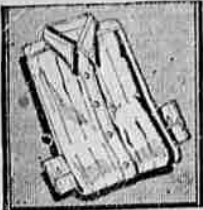

ROSEBURG, Ore., Dec. 10 (AP)—While banks in the Umpqua valley designed their vaults for the storage of gold, silver and currency, products of farm and mine are now being stored in the vaults for safe keeping.

Broccoli seed is far more valuable than its weight in silver. A pound of broccoli seed brings from \$20 to \$25 a pound, and seed growers deposit their product in the bank vaults for safe keeping.

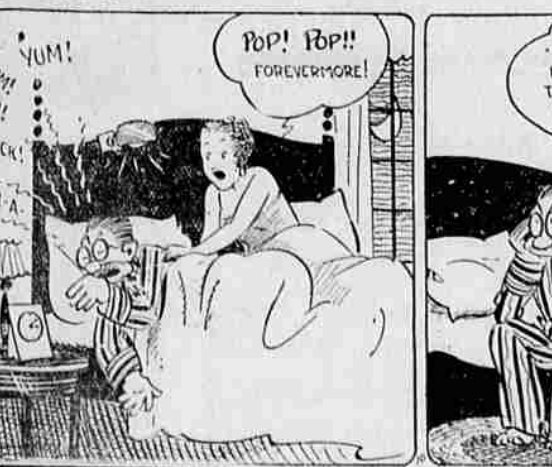

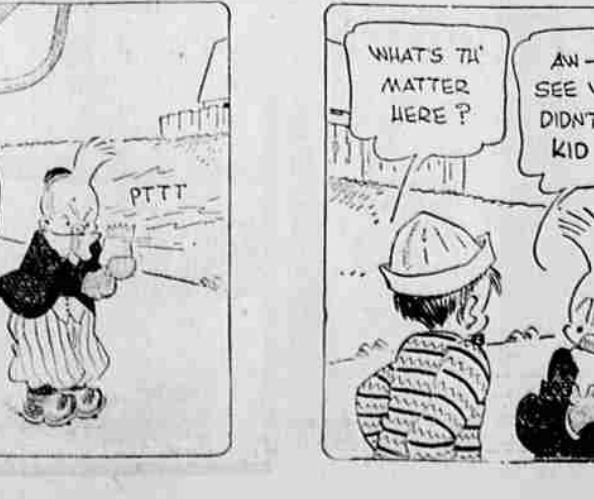
