TROJANS FACING CARNEGIE DEC. 14

Southern California Works Out Against Specially Coached Reserves

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 12 (AP)—Coach Howard Jones plans for his University of Southern California football aggregation definitely to do something here Saturday about the array of trick plays credited to the Trojan team from Carnegie Tech.

Further dummy scrimmage, pointed to build a defense against the prize collection of spread formations, passes and line thrusts expected from the invaders, is on the schedule for this afternoon after the hard clash yesterday between the varsity and the reserves. Even the darkness, which shrouded the goal posts of Howard field, failed to halt the session.

Ex-Stars on Reserves
Former Trojan stars, Jess Hibbs at tackle, Morley Drury at end, and Aubrey Devine, freshman coach, were on the reserve eleven, which turned loose some of the Carnegie tricks. For the most part their efforts were unheeded.

In turn when the varsity took the ball, it hammered through to a touchdown in short order with Russell Saunders quarterback, and Jimmy Muech, fullback, carrying the brunt of the attack. Ernie Pinckert and Harry Edelson completed the backfield combination. While the Trojan coaching staff was laying plans for more scrimmage today, twenty-seven members of the Carnegie Tech squad, with their coaching staff, spent the day at the Grand Canyon. Yesterday they turned out at Winslow, Ariz., for a light workout.

BIG TICKET DEMAND
LOS ANGELES, Dec. 12 (AP)—Indications are that the Rose Bowl, scene of the Tournament of Roses clash between the University of Southern California and Pittsburgh football eleven, will be sold out long before New Year's day. Arnold Hddy, assistant graduate manager of the Trojan institution said today.

Two days after application for tickets were mailed, Hddy said, 23,000 of the approximately 70,000 seats were sold. "If the present rate keeps up, there will be no public sale, all of the tickets going by application," he announced.

Of these tickets, 2,000 went to Pittsburgh alumni and 2,500 to the Trojan rooting section.

Butter Prices Lower Today In Portland Mart
PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 12 (AP)—Butter prices were materially lower on the Portland produce exchange today. Extras and standards were clipped for declines of three cents each, prime firsts four cents and firsts one cent. Butterfat prices tumbled likewise, the cut averaging 4 cents. Eggs were weaker with extras quoted at 44¢ and standards at 43¢ and 44¢.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland News Bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

Cauliflower prices registered sharp declines, with total shipments of 53 cars representing the heaviest volume in the last 2 months. Local sales to retailers and an occasional carlot sale are around \$1.25-\$1.50 per crate. Onions are full, California proving the most satisfactory outlet for Oregon loadings at present. Growers in the Lahish district are receiving \$1 per cwt., plus sacks, for No. 1 stock. Portland retailers are paying around \$1.75 in single sack purchases, with quantity as low as \$1.50.

A temporary flurry is occasioned by the difficulty in harvesting spinach, and good clean stock advanced to \$1.50 per orange box.

East Is 20 Pct. Handicapped In West Game, Claim
HAMILTON, N. Y., Dec. 12 (AP)—"The best an Eastern football team (invading the Pacific coast) can expect is 20 per cent. the worst of it, according to Andy Kerr, Colgate coach, who also has charge of organizing the East team for the annual charity game with the West at San Francisco.

Kerr, in addition to his wide experience in eastern football, put in four years at Stanford university and has had opportunity to study the intercollegiate question from both angles. "Look out there and you'll see the reason," said Kerr, pointing to Whitwell field, the Colgate gridiron. "That field is frozen as hard as a rock and is as slippery as a mill pond. It is the same in any other section of the east or middle west. You can't hold practice on a field like that. Why, you can't even walk on it without slipping."

"On the coast it is different. They have fine football weather through New Year's. You can work them as hard as you want without incurring any injury risk. The difference in the weather conditions and training facilities amounts to at least 20 per cent. advantage for the coast team."

"The trip across the continent is no handicap either way in Kerr's opinion. 'It may be burdensome in some respects, but it is also restful,' he explained.

"In good weather, the western eleven is at no disadvantage coming east but would be heavily handicapped in rain or snow or extreme cold," Kerr declares.

"They don't have any of that November weather out there and they'd be best if they struck it here. During the season the eastern teams would give much better accounts of themselves."

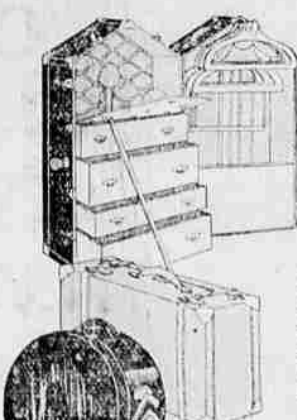
