PORTLAND PRODUCE
Portland, Ore., Dec. 13 (AP)—Butter, eggs, milk (butterfat), poultry, country meats, onions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cucumbers and hops, steady and unchanged.

Wheat Heavy And Lower At Close

CHICAGO, Dec. 13 (AP)—Pursuing an irregular downward course today, the Chicago wheat market finished at virtually the bottom figures reached. Sellers were in a majority most of the time, and buyers were scarce except when values dipped. Predictions that the United States will have 160,000,000 bushels of wheat remaining for export on Jan. 1 and that the Canadian wheat surplus then will be 190,000,000 bushels attracted considerable attention. Wheat closed heavy, 1 1/2% @ 1 1/2c a bushel under yesterday's finish.

Portland. Demand is limited, and trading is rather light. Spinach continues difficult to harvest, on account of muddy fields, and prices remain fairly high.

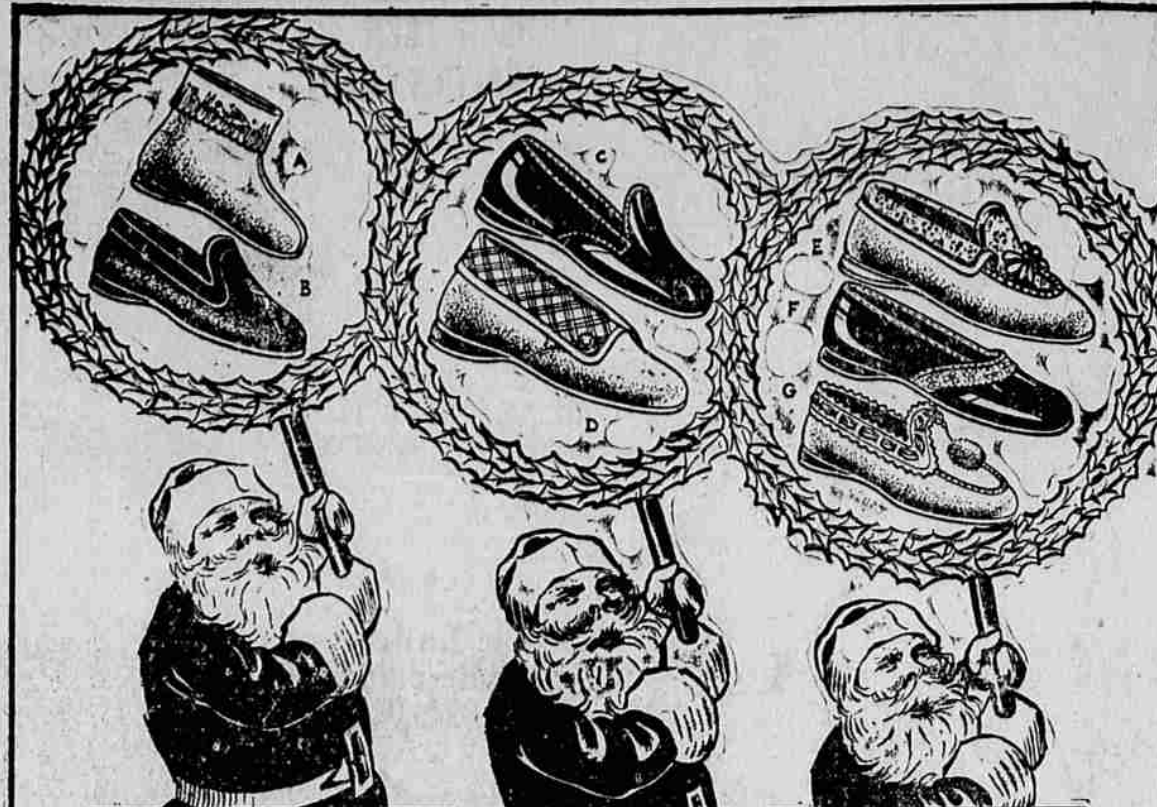
Rare Degree



Marking the first time in history, the University of Mexico, oldest university in the western hemisphere and founded in 1551, will confer its honorary degree on an American, Reginald Dean Root, A. B., of New York, above. In recognition of his character building influence as coach of the University of Mexico football squad, Root found the problem of teaching abstinence from alcohol and tobacco a difficult one, but it finally was overcome among his players. He was forced to employ an interpreter in his work and, in addition, had to serve as financial adviser to the university in the matter of sports.

Weak Undertone In Butter And Eggs

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13 (AP)—Recent declines in egg and butter prices have failed to add much strength to the products. Today there was still an undertone of weakness in both commodities. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says: First carlot arrival of Imperial valley lettuce sold at the high price of \$6.25 @ 6.50 per crate of 4 1/2-5 dozen heads. California lettuce supplies are liberal, with over 20 cars on track, but quality is mostly ordinary. Final shipments of the season of Valencia oranges are reported on the Portland docks. A short crop of Navels is predicted, and price advances, at least within the next few weeks, are prophesied by some distributors. Quality of Navel arrivals is improving. Tomato prices are advancing at southern shipping points and this is reflected in higher prices at

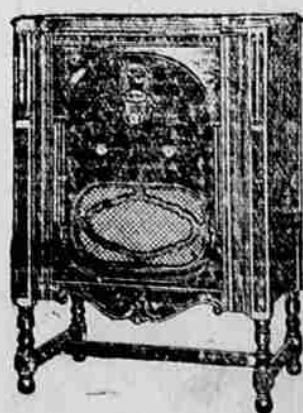
