STOCK MARKET
BREAK CAUSES
MORE BLAZES

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 14 (AP)—The November break in the stock market caused an increase in the number of incendiary fires throughout the country—at least it did in Oregon—says a circular that has been issued by State Insurance Commissioner Clara A. Lee. The incendiary fires, of course, were persons who lost on stocks, needed quick money and resorted to incendiarism so they might collect on insurance policies.

Lee's circular, entitled "The Moral Hazard," is sent to fire chiefs, special insurance agents and adjusters.

"Since the stock market crash numerous reports have been received of fires of suspicious origin and too many fires are being reported with the cause given as 'mysterious' or 'undetermined' says the letter. 'The reports of November fires received by the department from fire chiefs, insurance companies and press clippings show that 49, or exactly one-half, of the total of 98 fires reported come under the classification of 'unknown' or 'undetermined,' and 54 per cent of the total losses for the month are under these classifications."

Floods Continue
In Portugal Today

LISBON, Portugal, Dec. 14 (AP)—Floods and storms today continued to rage in all parts of Portugal in some cases driving families from their homes.

At Miranha near Fianloca fifty families, numbering in all 200 persons, were made homeless by floods when the river Felha burst its banks. Several houses caved in and many were threatened with destruction. The population fled in panic.

The flood waters swept a cemetery and tore open tombs, several coffins being carried away on the river.

Zaimis Elected
Greek President

ATHENS, Dec. 14 (AP)—Alexander Zaimis, who preceded M. Venizelos as premier, was elected president of Greece by the Greek parliament today. He succeeds Admiral Kondouriotis, who resigned this week because of ill health and approaching old age.

LEAVES RED CROSS MONEY

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 14 (AP)—An envelope containing \$50 and marked "For Red Cross" was left untouched by a burglar who rifled the safe on the steamship Nabesna of the McCormick line, wharfed here last night. He did take, however, \$250.

The safe was in the captain's quarters and entrance was gained by a pass key. Captain G. H. Swanson reported the theft to police.

CHEMIST IS KILLED

BARTLESVILLE, Okla., Dec. 14 (AP)—One of four chemists employed in the gasoline experimental station of the United States bureau of mines was killed and the other three burned, one critically, in an explosion which, with the ensuing fire, demolished the station last night.

The body of R. B. Bradenbaker was recovered from the smoking ruins, while Meredith Miles lay in a hospital so severely burned that it was feared he would not recover.

PLUMBER IS INDICTED

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Dec. 14 (AP)—John C. Wright, plumber, was indicted for first degree murder yesterday by the county grand jury. He will be arraigned Monday. It is expected he will plead not guilty to slaying Sydney Darling, Klamath hotel owner.

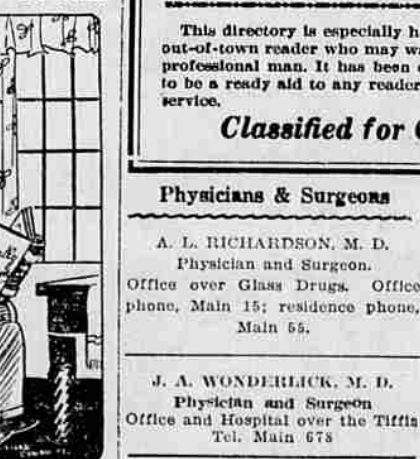

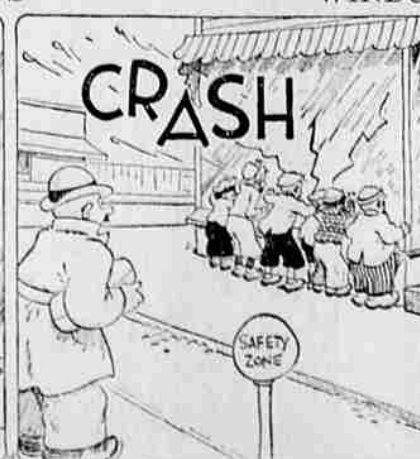

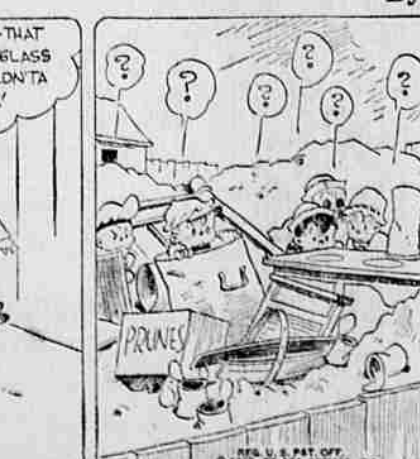
