WILBUR, Wash., Dec. 25 (AP)—Michael (Silent) Rowan, 54, whose leather knickerbockers flicked the chins of many would-be lightweight champions more than 30 years ago, fought his last fight last night in a pool hall here.

As the bell sounded for the end of the third round in an exhibition contest with his brother, John, the veteran of thousands of battles crumpled to the floor and his heart stopped beating. The two men, who for many years have "played" small towns in exhibition boxing matches, staged an impromptu contest in the pool hall here, the gate to be whatever coins the on-lookers cared to toss into the "ring." A preliminary examination by physicians indicated that the fighters had succumbed to heart disease.

"Old timers" said that Silent and his brother had been high in the lightweight and featherweight classes 30 years ago. They had been touring the west and spent the summer in the vicinity of Salt Lake. Both men were deaf mutes.
