Price of Flour Not Stabilized; Green Stuff In

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 27 (AP)—With egg and butter prices stabilized for a time at least, flour has taken their place as the jumping jack of the commodity market. Wheat's fluctuations up and down have placed it in and out of the flour prices. The cereal had been advancing up to this morning, when weaker prices were announced at both Liverpool and Chicago. Before this, however, flour had soared up on an average of 40 cents a barrel for the standard brands. Whether there will be a decrease to take up the slack in the new wheat quotations remains problematical. At any rate, it is not well to expect stable flour prices until wheat has taken on a more permanent tone value.

Itaw milk was notably lower. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says: "Movement of fresh fruits and vegetables on the Portland wholesale market, was the heaviest in many weeks, last Monday and Tuesday. Trading was limited to actual necessities today."

"Unofficial reports indicate potato storage holdings at the Klamath Falls district of 500 cars and at Deschutes of 75-100 cars. These storage holdings represent about 50 per cent of the total production of these two districts. Potato movement, which has been full for several weeks, was not especially accelerated by the holiday trading which characterized most classes of fruits and vegetables."

"Weaker shipping point lettuce markets, during the last week, is finally reflected in lower Portland prices today. Good quality lettuce from Imperial Valley and Arizona, which arrived too late for the holiday trade, was offered at sharp reductions."

"First winter arrivals from Mexico appeared today, with a carload of tomatoes and green peas. Quality is very good, and prices fairly high, with repacked Mexican tomatoes at \$4.50-\$5.00 per bag, or occasionally higher, and peas at \$6.00-\$6.50 per crate of 45 pounds."

Wheat Drops Two Cents In Chicago

CHICAGO, Dec. 27 (AP)—Sharp setbacks of Liverpool quotations led to early downward movement in wheat values here. The Liverpool breaks were ascribed to undoing of so-called spread transactions between Liverpool and other market centers, and to weakness of Argentine prices in the face of heavily curtailed official Argentine crop estimates. Opening 1 1/2 to 2 1/4 off, Chicago wheat later showed some power to rally. Corn, oats and provisions were easy.

Wheat closed unsettled 1 1/2 to 2 1/4 a bushel under yesterday's finish. Corn closed 4 1/2 to 1/2 off, oats 1/2 to 1/4 off, and provisions varying from 5c setback to a rise of 2 1/2 c.

Tacoma Father Kills Girl, Self

TACOMA, Dec. 27 (AP)—A five-year-old Tacoma girl was murdered yesterday by her father, who poured a powerful poison down her throat and who then ended his life in the same manner.

The principals in the dual tragedy were Edward Bond, 41, proprietor of a service station and Lita Bond, his daughter.

The girl was dead when she was taken to the county hospital at noon by Silas Young.

Bond was still breathing when he reached the hospital 15 minutes later but died before he could be placed on the operating table.

Sculptress Found Dead In Studio

CHICAGO, Dec. 27 (AP)—Tennessee Mitchell Anderson, Chicago sculptress and divorced wife of Sherwood Anderson, the novelist, was found dead last night in her studio in the artists' colony on the near North Side. She was 52 years old.

Despite the appearance of blood stains on the pillows of the bed on which Mrs. Anderson's body was found, death was believed to have been from natural causes. The death certificate had not been signed early today, but the coroner's office indicated there would be no inquest. Death, according to coroner's physicians, was caused by a hemorrhage.

Death came some time between last Friday night and yesterday. A maid found the apartment locked Saturday and on subsequent days when she knocked. Yesterday she became alarmed and notified police.

Amateur Boxing Tourney Is Dated

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 27 (AP)—James J. Richardson, manager of the Multnomah Amateur Athletic club here, announced today that the Pacific coast amateur boxing championship tournament will be held here March 13 and 14, under the auspices of the club. This will be the second consecutive year that the meet has been brought to Portland. Boxers from the entire west will participate and applications will be received from as far east as Denver, as far south as San Diego, and from Alaska and Vancouver, B. C., to the north. Nearly one hundred boxers took part in the last meet.

MANY ATTEND BIBLE CLASSES

EUGENE, Ore. (AP)—There are 1,112 children participating in the week-day Bible school work in Eugene public schools, according to Mrs. Casper M. Wood of the community council of religious education which is supervising the work. The children have given 26 churches as their affiliations, while 193 children listed no church affiliation.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP)—A "symbolic theater service" will be opened here January 5 by the Rev. Fred J. Clark of Eugene, who resigned from the pastorate of the First Congregational church some time ago. The church will be conducted in the Colonial theater and the Rev. Mr. Clark has called his experiment "Fetters leaving the church."
