Wheat Nervous And Higher At Closing Today
 CHICAGO, Dec. 28 (AP)—Assertions that Argentina has only 50,000,000 bushels of wheat available to meet European needs this season did much to kite wheat prices skyward today. Bestock, some United States hard winter wheat at the Gulf of Mexico was reported to have been disposed of at the same price as May delivery, about 1c a bushel above the basis prevailing in export circles. Under such circumstances, offerings of future deliveries in Chicago were readily absorbed during the late dealings today, houses with foreign and seaboard connections taking the lead as buyers, and prices rising rapidly far more than offsetting early declines.

Scholastic athletic contests will be considered as a semester's attendance.

"No school shall be a member of the association if the athletic coach is not a full-time teacher in the school, and no part of the coach's salary is to come from any other source than the school organization employing him."

"Any school whose students supporters, rooters or partisans take part in riots, fights, pilfering, paddling or any unsportsmanlike conduct against any other school in the association shall forfeit all games played and won and shall be automatically suspended for an indefinite period."

"No member of a high school shall be eligible to represent his high school unless he has been in attendance the semester immediately preceding."

Sentiment expressed at the preliminary meeting indicated the possibility that Salem may be allowed to participate in the annual state high school basketball tournament held in Salem each year, whether or not Salem wins the division title in its district.

The rule providing that no school shall be a member of the association if the athletic coach is not a full-time teacher in the school, was interpreted by the association today as having no bearing upon the status of volunteer assistant coaches, whose positions are neither professional nor professional and who receive no payment for their assistance.
