SEVEN-STORY BUILDING ANNOUNCED

STRUCTURE PLANNED BY MR. ROESCH

Construction is to Start Immediately at Washington and Fir. TO CONNECT WITH SACAJAWEA INN

As a New Year's present to the city of La Grande, Julius Roesch announced today a new building project, which may be the largest of the year in La Grande.

Mr. Roesch, capitalist and builder and owner of the Sacajawea Inn and other important buildings in La Grande, formulated the plans for his new building project immediately following the call of President Hoover for all persons to work and build so that the country may stabilize conditions and keep business and industry on an even keel.

The new building will be 120 by 110 feet in dimensions, the main part of the structure to be T-shaped, with full basement, reinforced concrete and brick facing and mill constructed interior.
