Alta Wigglesworth, who was hurt by a sled while coasting, was unable to go to school but is recovering.

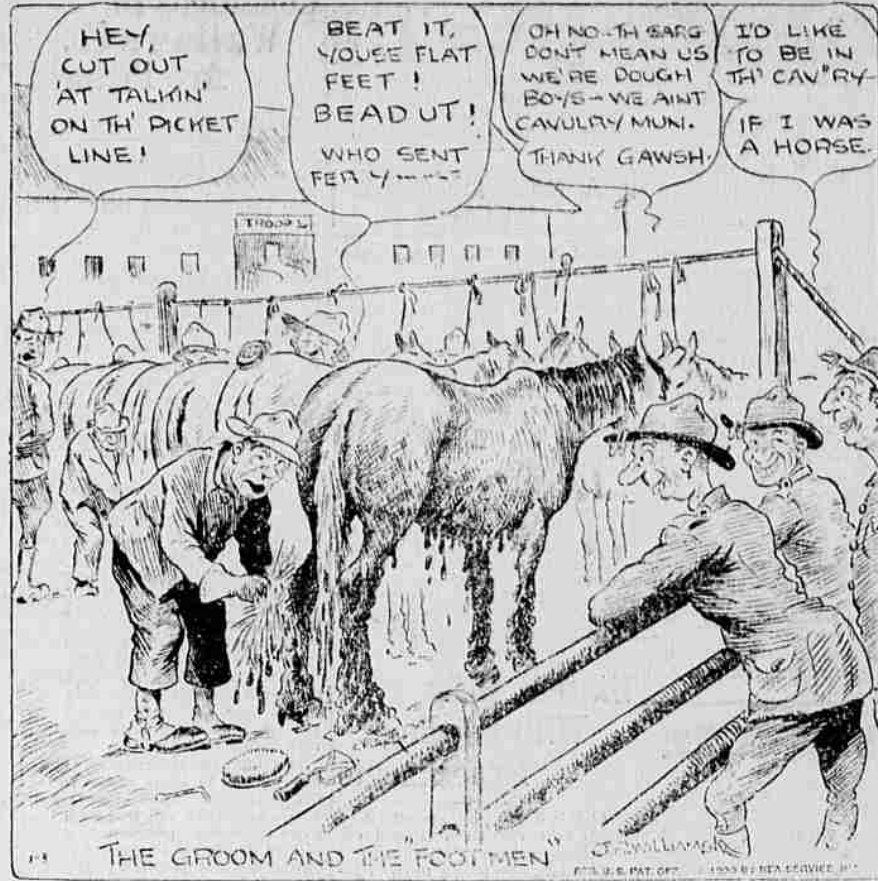

Inheritance Tax Payments During 1929 At Million

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 3 (AP)—Inheritance tax payments received by the state of Oregon during 1929 aggregated \$1,000,311.69, which is about \$300,000 more than for any previous year, says a statement by State Treasurer T. B. Kay.

In addition to this amount collections totaling \$156,622.36 are being carried as unrecipited items pending definite determination of the taxes.

Collection costs, capital outlay and refunds for the year were approximately .913 per cent of receipts.

Inheritance tax payments received from Multnomah county totaled \$836,621.15 or about 84 per cent of the whole. Among large estates paying in that county were the Lane estate and those of John R. Yeon, Eric V. Hauser and Charles Russell.

Other counties from which inheritance taxes of \$10,000 or more were received were as follows: Jackson, \$10,332.98; Umatilla, \$81,631.09; Washington, \$28,222.72; Yamhill, \$33,849.51.
