he goes. If his headache were very painful the doctor probably would prescribe something. But—and this is what Jones does not appreciate—before prescribing for him the doctor would attempt to discover the cause of the headache.

Having discovered that, then with the pill or powder he'd given Jones such advice as would help to remove the cause of the pain, and to prevent its recurrence.

Ache in the head can be compared to soreness in a thumb. When the thumb is sore we know it and it is easy to trace the cause.

It is a much more complicated matter to trace the cause of a headache. An aching head is a signal something is wrong in the body. It may be due to excessive smoking, constipation, sustained application of fatiguing work, eye-strain, or any number of other conditions.

Unless you can be absolutely certain of your own diagnosis, and that the condition you attribute the headache to is harmless, it is better wisdom to call in the expert.

To dose a headache without knowing and removing its cause is to pass unheeding the danger signal.

Columbia River Project Costing \$6,000,000 Sum

SEATTLE, Jan. 10 (AP)—A contract involving the expenditure of \$6,000,000 this year has been let by the Engineers Public Service corporation to Stone and Webster Engineering corporation to construct the first unit of a \$15,000,000 hydro-electric project at Rock Island on the Columbia river, near Wenatchee.

This was announced here by William H. McGrath, vice president of the Puget Sound Power and Light company.

Federal license was issued and accepted for the construction of the dam by the Washington Electric company, a subsidiary of the Puget Sound Power and Light company, which in turn is a subsidiary of the Engineers' Public Service corporation.
