Shute Remains At Top In L. A. Golf Tourney

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 14 (AP)—Lawrence Shute, 1929's young professional golf champion, today was knocking at the treasury door of the fifth annual Los Angeles \$10,000 open tournament.

Three strokes ahead of the field of 47 other competitors for first place and \$2,500 prize money, the slender entrant from Columbus with a low card of 222 for 54 holes looked to the final 72 as an opportunity to make his first bow as an important titleholder.

Athletics And Browns Put Up Best Defenses

CHICAGO, Jan. 14 (AP)—The world's champion Philadelphia Athletics and the St. Louis Browns had the tightest defenses of all American league clubs in 1929, official fielding averages disclosed today.

The Athletics accepted 5,641 chances and the Browns 5,871, each compiling a grand season's average of .875 or three points higher than the leading mark recorded by Washington in 1928 and two points less than the all-time mark, 89.4, recorded by the New York Yankees in 1922.

Detroit, leader in team hitting, was last in team fielding, making 242 errors for an average of .941. New York was third with a .971 average; Chicago fourth with .970, and Washington and Cleveland tied for fifth and sixth with .985. Boston, was a .945 mark, was seventh.

Kamm Retains Title

Only one player, Willie Kamm of the Chicago White Sox, retained his fielding championship. Kamm defended his third bare post at a .978 clip, accepting 481 chances and making but 11 errors in 142 games. In 1928, he fielded .977.

Joe Judge, Washington veteran, led the first basemen. He played in 142 games, made 1,222 putouts and 88 assists and only six errors for an average of .986. Lew Fonseca, of Cleveland, new American league batting champion, was second to Judge with a .985 average.

Charles Gehringer, Detroit's youthful second baseman, was the best defensive player of the year around the keystone station. He had 494 putouts, 364 assists and but 23 errors in 154 games for a .975 mark. Delmonico also participated in 32 double plays. John Hodge, of Cleveland had an average of .977 but he competed in only 72 games.

Holey the Best

Shortstops were unusually mediocre on defense in 1929, the averages revealed, with Joe Holey of the Athletics the best in the field with a .921 average, the same mark as that with which Joe Sewell of Cleveland led the field in 1928. Holey played in only 48 games but reached his best form late in the season, and played brilliantly in the world series. The Philadelphia veteran's record was 181 putouts, 228 assists and 11 errors. Leo Durander was second with a .928 average.

Al Simmons of the Athletics and Fred Schulte of the Browns led for first place among the outfielders with .918 averages. In 112 games at center-field, Schulte accepted 372 chances while Simmons had 285 in 117 games in left field.

Riel and Cochrane Hit

Harold Riel led the catchers with .906 for 82 games although Gordon "Mickey" Cochrane of the Athletics, whose average was .911, was regarded as the best backstop in the league.

Thirteen pitchers, who were in 24 games or more, had perfect fielding records. Jack Russell of Boston, accepting 21 chances; Elin triple plays were executed throughout the season, two by the Yankees and one each by St. Louis, Chicago and Detroit. Willie Kamm, of the White Sox, completed a triple play by putting the hidden ball trick for the third time in his major league career.

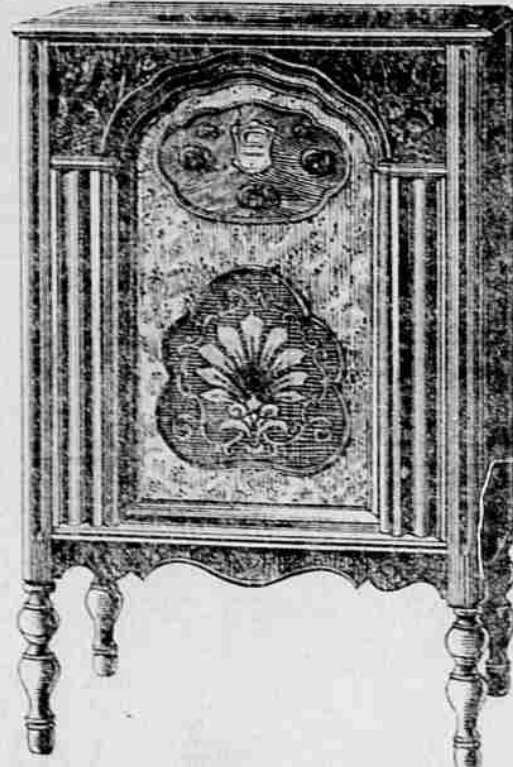
