### SPEARS ON WAY TO WEST TODAY

#### Oregon Offers Minnesota Mentor \$11,500 and Right to Practice Medicine.

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Jan. 16 (AP)—With the University of Minnesota making last minute efforts to keep him as head football coach, Dr. Clarence W. Spears started today for the west with the offer of an \$11,500 annual salary as a special coach at the University of Oregon awaiting him.

Dr. Spears was elected coach at Oregon at a meeting of the institution's executive council at Eugene last night and he will meet Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall, president of Oregon school at Missoula, Mont., Friday to discuss final arrangements.

Coach Spears has been dissatisfied with management of athletic affairs at Minnesota, especially over financial matters relating to the team.

land during the 24-hour period ending late last night. The fall was the heaviest in a single day for that district since December, 1919, when 13 inches blanketed the landscape. Similar conditions were reported from virtually all of Western Oregon. The minimum temperature at Portland was 28 degrees above zero with indications pointing to a rise.

A general thaw prevailed throughout the Rogue River valley following a silver thaw late yesterday in Medford. County equipment was working a 24-hour shift to clear the streets.

Public schools in Grants Pass were suspended today because of the inability of children to reach classes due to a two-foot snowfall.

Sheriff E. H. Lister issued a warning to residents of the low lands adjoining the Rogue river to be prepared to move to higher ground should a warm rain start. The county official predicted that such a condition would bring an unparalleled disaster to the county.

Pendleton experienced a temperature of 7 degrees above zero last night, one of the lowest readings taken in the state. Readings were: Baker, 10 degrees; Medford, 24; Portland, 19; Roseburg, 32; Walf Creek, 29; Eugene, 19; Albany, 22; Salem, 19; Spokane, zero; Walla, 8.

## Sport Slants

So it will be falling Phil the Sailor and Slippery Jack the Sailor in the big wind-jamming under the palms at Miami.

If the pay-off is actually on the announced basis of a 50-50 split of the fighter's and of the gate receipts, the honors already belong to the boy bandit, James J. Johnston, who handles falling Phil's business arrangements. The prospect of such profit is enough in itself to floor Scott in advance of the fight for his share may range anywhere from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

Johnston's seemingly occult powers have made him the Omnipotent God of New York boxing over a considerable period. His Svengali eye achieved a marvelous influence upon the aged Mike Terrone a few years ago, so much so that Johnston later was persuaded to take a ten-percent interest in the fistie fortunes of Sharkey. The Boston sailor, a moody specimen, did not respond to Johnston's persuasive treatment but the arrival of Phil Scott furnished a new and inviting subject.

In the first round of his fight with Victorio Campolo at Ebbets Field, Scott was tottering under terrific punishment and about to go down when he suddenly heard a Johnstonian command from his corner: "Box him!" Phil, having got the worst of a slugging bee, promptly obeyed and won the match on points.

After being hit a low, glancing blow on the thigh by Otto Von Forst, Scott took one look toward his corner, caught Johnston's babbled eye and quickly dove to the canvas.

"Can you imagine that for a kid break?" remarked Johnston afterward. "I wagered a few quid on Scott but stipulated all bets were off in case of a foul, so I don't collect a dime."

The Scott-Sharkey fight will be the first real financial test for boxing in the Florida winter resort area. Last year, extraordinary developments made the Stribling-Sharkey match a profitable venture, to the tune of \$400,000. The fight itself was merely an agency, one item in an unusual extravaganza, built-up by the ballyhoo after the death of Tex Rickard. It gave the fans an excuse to go somewhere and see their friends or celebrities. It brought Jack Dempsey to the fore-front as a promoter, carrying on for his old pal. The posters advertising the bout throughout Florida had Dempsey's name in bigger letters than those of the actual principals. A newcomer got the idea that Dempsey was the main bout, with Sharkey and Stribling appearing in the semi-final.

Most of these elements will be missed this February. It will be just a fight and the ballyhoo can hardly be stimulated without the employment of extraordinary ingenuity. Under the circumstances, a "gate" of \$250,000 would appear optimistic. If it tops that figure, Madison Square Garden's five-year contract with the city of Miami will seem a far-sighted document. Otherwise it may be just another seran of paper.

CONTRACT MAILED TO BABE NEW YORK, Jan. 16 (AP)—The contract mailed to Babe Ruth by the New York Yankees calls for a salary of \$75,000 a year for a two year term. These were the terms the Babe declined recently before he left for Florida, holding out for \$85,000.

### Simmons Leads League In Run Getting In '29

Mickelson (Associated Press Sports Writer) CHICAGO, Jan. 16 (AP)—Al Simmons performed his duty as cleanup man for the champion Philadelphia Athletics in championship style last season, leading the circuit in the important business of getting in runs, official 1929 averages revealed today.

The heavy swinging Philadelphia participated in 144 games and drove in 157 of the 591 runs scored all season by Connie Mack's team. Thirty-four times he scored himself by home runs and came home 59 more through the assistance of his mates.

Babe Ruth, playing eight less games than Simmons, was second with 144. The Bambino tied with his Yankee teammate, Lou Gehrig, for the honors in 1928 with 142.

Simmons and Ruth were the only two American league batsmen to drive in an average of one or more runs a game during 1929. Dale Alexander, husky Detroit rookie, finished third by driving in 137 runs in 155 games while Gehrig was next, sending 126 runs across in 154 games. Other leaders and

the number of runs they batted in were: Hollman, Detroit, 120; Fox, Philadelphia, 117; Kress, St. Louis, 107; Gehring, Detroit, 106; Ladd, New York, 106; and Paterson, Cleveland, first baseman who won the American league batting championship, 107.
