FOLSOM PRISON, Cal., Jan. 17 (AP)—Eugene Crosby, alias James Gleason, fifth of six convicts sentenced to hang for the murder of George Baker, a prisoner, during the 1927 Thanksgiving day riot here, paid with his life on the gallows today. The trap was sprung at 10:02:30 a. m. and he was pronounced dead at 10:17:10 a. m.
