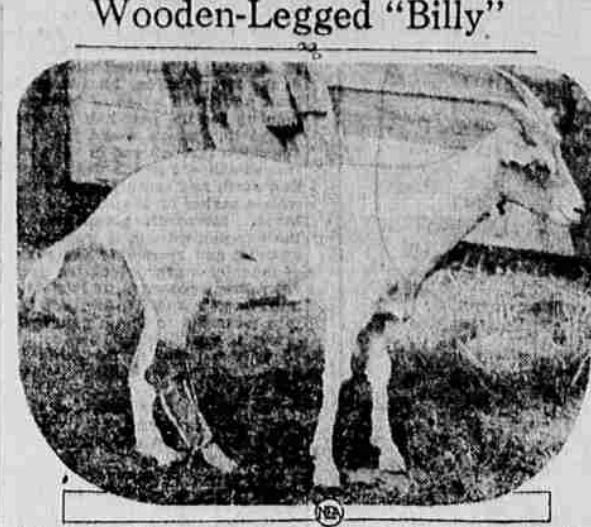


LOCAL BRIEFS
