

### Accidents Take 2,229 Lives In Fifteen Years

RALEM, Ore. (AP)—During the fifteen and one-half years since the state industrial accident commission was created and began to keep a check on accidental injuries or deaths suffered by men engaged in Oregon industries, enough men have been killed in this state to fill a large cemetery and to number the population of the city of Portland.

In actual figures the number of workers killed during that period totals 2,229, an average of more than 140 a year and the number injured aggregated 475,959, an average of more than 32,497 annually. The number injured includes the fatalities.

**Deaths Increase**

The trend of these industrial casualties is on the increase. For the year since July 1, 1925 to June 30, 1929, the number of fatalities was 200. For the six months period from July 1, 1929 to December 30, 1929 the number was 119, indicating that the record for industrial deaths for the year to close this year will beat all records.

The same is true concerning non-fatal accidents. All accidents, both fatal and non-fatal, numbered 41,295 for the year 1928-1929 and for the first six months of the present year to end June 30 next the number was 22,771.

The above figures do not take in consideration the hundreds of persons injured each year while engaged in industries that do not operate under the provisions of the workmen's compensation act which is administered by the industrial accident commission.

During the period since the department was organized its financial receipts have totaled \$35,529, \$78,84 and its disbursements \$28,092, \$92,98.

Receipts for the year July 1, 1928 to June 30, 1929 totaled \$3,449,192.69 and disbursements \$2,885,552.59.

Lambs Begin To Arrive At Farms In Wallowa Area

WALLOWA, Ore. (Special)—Reports from some of the farms over the community state that lambing is starting in a small way at some farms. The sheep as well as other classes of livestock in this community are doing well at this time.
