

Horton Smith And Al Espinosa In One-Stroke Lead In Agua Caliente

AGUA CALIENTE, Lower California, Mex., Jan. 22 (AP)—The stubborn, subtle Agua Caliente course which through 54 holes of play refused permission to pass its par barrier of 71 strokes, today stretched out in menacing fashion before fifty eight prospectors of the world's largest golf treasure as they faced the final round of the \$25,000 classic.

With the \$10,000 first place prize almost within their grasp, two pacemakers, Horton Smith and Al Espinosa, clinging to a meager one stroke advantage as they trudged to the final 18 holes, already eleven strokes over perfect figures. Their score for the three days of play stood at 224.

But any one of a dozen or more contenders pressed closely behind within striking distance of the championship as they paraded toward the pot of gold which marks the end of the "rainbow trail" through Pacific coast winter money tournaments.

Nearest Trio
The nearest of these were Al Watrous, Detroit; Charles Guest, Los Angeles, and Olin Dutra, Santa Monica, Cal., just a stroke behind the 21-year-old Missourian and the master artist of the fairways from Chicago. Two strokes away was Johnny Farrell, the strongest eastern threat, while Morrie Dutra, Tacoma, Wash.; MacDonald Smith, Long Island, N. Y.

DR. SARPOLIS TRIMS HOWARD CANTONWINE

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 22 (AP)—Dr. Kurt Sarpolis, wrestling physician of Cleveland, Ohio, former University of Chicago football star, defeated Howard Cantonwine, former Iowa football star, two out of three falls here last night. In doing so, Sarpolis introduced to wrestling fans his flying body somersault, seen here for the first time. Cantonwine took the first fall in 23 minutes and 15 seconds with a double wristlock. Sarpolis used little more than ten minutes.
