

### ADMIRE U. S. FOR CHEERFULNESS

#### Bishop Deane, of Scotland, Says America Still Has Anglo-Saxon Soul.

OMAHA, Neb., Feb. 5 (AP)—The United States still retains "the Anglo-Saxon soul," despite the contention that the nation is a "melting pot," Right Rev. F. J. Deane, Episcopal bishop of Aberdeen, Scotland, told professional men here.

"We joke about America and Americans, but that's because we feel we are privileged because of our friendship," he stated in his address last night.

"You Americans invented the league of nations, you know, and then wouldn't join it; you invented the treaty of Versailles and wouldn't sign it; you invented the cocktail and now you won't drink it."

"Despite these occasional inconsistencies we admire you immensely," Bishop Deane added.

#### Admire Cheerfulness

"We admire the cheerfulness and fortitude with which you met that Wall Street crash that would most certainly have spread ruin in any other nation."

"We love your ambassador at London because he smiles a pleasant grin and because he always uses picturesque language. He has captured the heart of England."

The Scotch bishop urged that the United States "abandon its ridiculous tradition of isolation and assume responsibility for leadership of the human race."

### CORONERS TO AIR TROUBLES AT PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 4 (AP)—Protests that a recent death certificate issued by Dr. Frederick D. Stricker, secretary of the state health board, practically abolished the office of county coroners will be aired before Stanley Mires, district attorney, tomorrow with coroners from many Oregon counties attending.

Dr. Earl Smith, Multnomah county (Portland) coroner, who is leading the opposition to the new form of certificate, said that under Dr. Stricker's ruling it would be unnecessary for a physician to notify the coroner of a violent death. The coroners contend this would lead to an unlimited complication in settling insurance claims.

The revised death certificate does not provide a certificate for use of coroners. It is asserted and in many cases it is impossible for the coroner to determine the cause without an autopsy.

### Ministers Against Opening Caskets

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 4 (AP)—Some reaction was expected today to the resolution by the Portland Ministerial association favoring discontinuance of the conventional custom of taking one last look at the body during funerals.

The ministers expressed the opinion the custom was a relic of the dark ages and after Dr. Leonard Bowman, pastor of the first Presbyterian church, submitted the resolution, it was decided to withhold definite action until churches represented in the association discussed it thoroughly.

Dr. Bowman said funerals are far less harrowing than they used to be and practices are more civilized than formerly.

Although no definite opposition to the resolution has appeared, considerable discussion was heard in women's club circles.

### River Steamer Is A Virtual Wreck

PORTLAND, Feb. 4 (AP)—The river steamer N. R. Lang, of the Western Transportation company, loaded with \$20,000 worth of paper from Canas, Wash., mills by near the Washington shore, above Vancouver, Wash., today a virtual wreck.

Caught in the path of huge ice chunks and two log rafts, the steamer, which had been bound since January 18 in the Columbia river, was badly crushed and partially submerged near Ryan's Point late yesterday.

Word was received by Rex Gault, of the transportation company, who said six men aboard the craft escaped to the shore without injury.

### Hawaiian Debate Team Is Winner

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 4 (AP)—University of Hawaii debaters proved the most convincing talkers when they met Willamette university three men team here last night and were given the decision.

The invaders upheld the affirmative side of the question "Resolved that the nation should adopt a plan of complete disarmament excepting such forces as are needed for police purposes."

Six of the nine principle points in debate were declared a draw, while Hawaii was declared best in analysis and persuasion. Willamette men were held superior in presentation.

### CONSIDER MILK ORDINANCE

THE DALLER, Ore., Feb. 4 (AP)—The city council is considering adoption of a standardized milk ordinance which provides for production and distribution of the food product under four grades, either pasteurized or raw.

### WORK BEGINS ON IRRIGATION TEST, GERVAIS

SALEM, Ore., (AP)—Work has been started near Gervais on the first of a series of demonstration irrigation wells to be developed by the Oregon experiment station through funds contributed by a group of Oregon public utilities, banks, civic organizations. The well now being bored is on the fruit farm of Senator Sam Brown along the Pacific highway.

Studies already conducted with Willamette valley lands under irrigation by the experiment station have proved the value of supplemental water for at least a half million acres of natural drained soils. The present project is an attempt to establish the feasibility of providing such irrigation from deep wells.

As soon as the Marion county well is completed a second will be bored on the Forest Hill daily range near Monmouth, Polk county. The water there will be used primarily for establishing permanent irrigated pastures which are deemed necessary to most profitable dairying in Western Oregon.

If indications for preliminary surveys are correct the flow from each well should amount to about one and one-half feet or enough to care for about 100 acres on such farms, according to Dr. W. L. Powers, head of the soils department, at the state college, who is in direct charge of the project.

Under the cooperative plan adopted, the private fund raised is turned over to the experiment station to use as a revolving fund in establishing the wells. After they are in successful operation the farm owners agree to take over the wells and equipment at cost, though any expense used in pure experimentation or running check tests will be paid from the fund.

In this way it is hoped to use the money a number of times in establishing demonstration wells throughout the valley area suitable to such irrigation.

### EXPENDITURES FOR 1930 TOTAL \$10,000,000,000

NEW YORK (AP)—Security offerings in 1930 will exceed those of 1929 if all projected governmental and industrial expenditures are carried out.

Total construction work indicated for 1930, as already announced by municipalities, industries and the federal government is estimated at \$10,000,000,000.

Offerings of new securities in 1929 fell short of this figure by approximately \$100,000,000 based on authoritative banking statistics.

Prospective security offerings for 1930 will be further augmented if forecasts of greater foreign offerings materialize. Foreign bond issues in 1929 were less than ten per cent of the total new securities.

### ASSISTANT TO SPEARS?

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Feb. 4 (AP)—Earl Murtineau, assistant football coach at Purdue university, said today a report that he was being considered for chief assistant to Clarence Spears, new coach at the University of Oregon, was news to him.

"I may be under consideration," he said, "but I have never been approached."

Dabe Herman, Brooklyn's big slugger, says he will hold out for \$20,000 this year.

### Eielson Search Is Abandoned By Soviet Russia

MOSCOW, Feb. 5 (AP)—The Arctic commission of the Soviet government has abandoned all further search for Carl Ben Eielson and his companion, Earl Burdick, in the belief that the two American airmen perished in Siberia.

Officials of the Arctic commission had persisted in their search for the two men despite the discovery of Eielson's wrecked plane on the Siberian coast on Jan. 25. There was no trace of the two flyers who had been missing in the Arctic since Nov. 9 but there was still a hope that they might have survived the crash and made their way to some place of safety.

Tuesday, however, the Arctic commission reluctantly acknowledged the conclusion that the two Americans had perished and consequently announced abandonment of all further search for the courageous Americans who gave their lives in an effort to bring aid to the stranded trading ship *Nanuk* off the northern coast of Siberia.

### THE GREEN IN PLANTS IS EVIDENCE OF WORK

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—Green may be a rosy color to the eye, but to a plant it is the sign of hard work.

This is shown in a discovery about the green coloring matter of plants reported to the American Association for the Advancement of Science by Dr. Robert Emerson of Harvard university.

The green in plants is chlorophyll, which long has been known as the chemical substance that enables plants to transform the sun's energy into the things which make food and fuel for man.
