Oregon Town Is Marooned By A Gigantic Slide

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 12 (AP)—The town of Detroit about 60 miles east of Salem in the Cascade mountains is marooned from the outside world by a gigantic slide which swept down the mountain alongside the government road between Niagara and Detroit and completely covered the road and the Hammond Lumber company railroad which runs alongside the highway. While the slide occurred Tuesday night J. R. Bewley roadmaster in the Detroit district, who tried all day Wednesday to get the road through to the county court at Salem, only succeeded this morning. Members of the county court and county roadmaster immediately went to the scene to get preparations under way to clear the roadway. In the meantime mail and passenger stage and railroad trains cannot get through and no means of communication is left with the town save a single strand of telephone wire. There is a small hotel at the town as well as stores and it is believed there is plenty of food available until a cut may be made through the slide which is said to cover both the road and railroad in a huge mass for over 50 feet. The slide said to be about four miles east of Niagara also cuts off Breitenbush Hot Springs, a thickly populated resort in the summer but now said to be occupied by but a few people. The road to Breitenbush runs off from Detroit.
