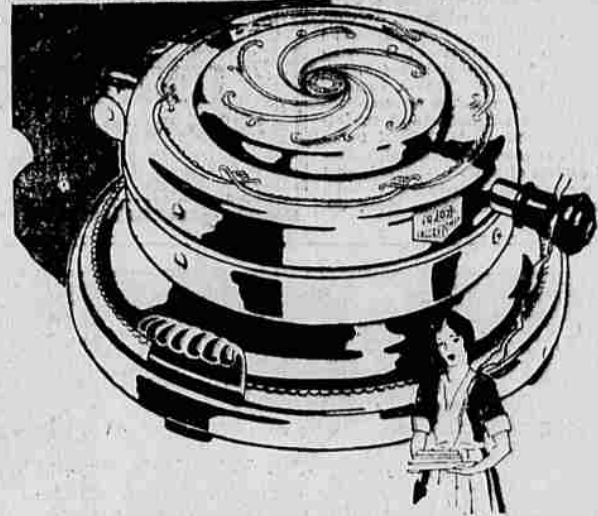

INCOME TAX FACTS

No. 11
Salaries paid employees constitute one of the largest items of business expenses. To be allowed such claims must conform closely

to the words of the revenue act, which provides for the deduction of a "reasonable" allowance for personal services actually rendered. The test of deductibility is whether the amounts paid are reasonable and whether they are, in fact, purely for personal services. Money paid an officer of a corporation for which no services are rendered or for services inadequate to the compensation, is not deductible as salary. Reasonable compensation is held to be an amount that ordinarily is paid by like enterprises in like circumstances for like services. For example, an officer of a corporation received in 1929 compensation in excess of the amount ordinarily paid for services such as he rendered, and which

bore a relationship to the amount of his stock holdings. The excess would not be treated as salary, but as a distribution of earnings of the corporation, and the amount of such excess would not be considered a deductible item.
