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**SALES CENSUS BY UNCLE SAM MAY AID TRADE**

**WASHINGTON (AP)—**The government, the butcher, the baker and the silk hose maker are preparing to join hands in an attempt to obtain the most comprehensive answer to the question, "How's business?"

It will be the census of merchandise distribution to be taken for the first time this spring.

A diagnosis from it is expected to aid the national advisory committee on business in its move to keep the "blood pressure" of trade at a healthy level at all times.

The census of distribution is entirely distinct from the regular 1939 population count, the census of agriculture and the enumeration of manufactures.

The government hopes thus to obtain a vivid picture of the ways in which American merchandise moves and to find some remedy for "stick distribution."
