GRAIN MARKETS ARE UNSETTLED

Government Report For Week Ending Mar. 1 Shows Marked Trends.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 2 (Special)—Grain markets were extremely unsettled during the week ending March 1. Wheat prices declined to the lowest point of the season, according to the weekly grain market review of the United States bureau of agricultural economics, and feed grains also turned sharply down, influenced principally by the weakness in wheat. Toward the close of the week the market strengthened materially and on February 23 prices for most grains had advanced to a point slightly above that of a week ago. Continued lack of export demand for the large market stocks in North America was largely responsible for the sharp decline, while increased buying activity in the futures markets, particularly for wheat for March and May delivery, together with a more active inquiry for cash grain and smaller offerings at the lower prices, were the principal strengthening influences in wheat. Feed grains were in steady demand while offerings became smaller. Prices regained all of the loss made early in the week and closed slightly higher than a week ago.

Although fluctuations in the wheat market were unusually large the general situation was not changed materially. European needs for bread grains were still being supplied principally from offerings of native wheat and shipments from the southern hemisphere. Argentine shipments during the week totaled about 3,000,000 bushels and Australian shipments about 2,250,000 bushels. No shipments from Black Sea ports were reported but Russia was expected to renew offerings should prices advance. Stocks of native wheat in Europe are diminishing but offerings are still fairly large and are restricting the demand for foreign wheats. Good native French milling wheat was quoted in Paris February 28 at \$1.25, and German wheat at Hamburg at \$1.50 per bushel. Argentine wheat continued to underbid wheat from other exporting countries outside of Europe. 65 1/2 pound Argentine Rosado wheat afloat sold in London February 28 at 1.17 1/2, compared with sales of No. 4 Manitoba from Vancouver at \$1.22 1/2 and No. 2 Manitoba at \$1.24. Australian wheat was offered at \$1.24-1.24 1/2. Quotations on United States wheat were mostly above an export basis with No. 2 hard winter quoted at 9.1c. New York at \$1.16 1/2 per bushel.

Wheat
Cash wheat markets were unsettled, influenced by the sharp fluctuations in future prices. A large percentage of country grain arrivals were taken on the basis of the loan value established by the farm board, but the remainder of the offerings sold at materially lower prices. Receipts were larger than during the previous week in southwestern markets where growers and country shippers were marketing freely to take advantage of the relatively high prices being paid for country grain wheat. Takings of this wheat, however, were limited toward the close of the week to offerings by cooperative marketing associations and shipments billed prior to or on February 24. Receipts of wheat

during February at Kansas City totaled 2757 cars compared with 4666 cars a year ago, and reflect the smaller supplies on farms this season. Shipments from that market during the week were less than half the receipts but stocks in public elevators were not increased since, increased amounts were being stored in mill elevators. Soft winter wheat also fluctuated with futures declining nearly 1c per bushel early in the week but later recovering all of the loss and closing February 23 about 1c higher than a week ago. Receipts of soft winter wheat at St. Louis were light and were in good demand. Coast Markets
Pacific coast markets followed most of the decline in eastern markets early in the week and later advanced when western markets turned upward. Demand for wheat continued dull but selling pressure from the growers and country shippers was light. Demand for milling wheat at San Francisco was limited with mills reducing accumulations rather than making new purchases. New flour business was reported of small volume and shipping directions on old contracts were difficult to obtain. Inquiry for feeding wheat from poultry raisers was moderately active and some wheat usually taken by mills was being absorbed by these buyers.

Cash wheat markets at Portland and Seattle did not regain all of the decline which took place early in the week but closed about 2c lower than a week ago, with No. 1 Big Bend Bluestem Hard White quoted at Portland February 28 at \$1.22 and at Seattle at \$1.24 per bushel. No. 1 Soft and Western White wheats were quoted at Portland at \$1.11 and at Seattle at \$1.14. No. 1 Hard Winter, Northern Spring and Western Red were quoted at Portland at \$1.09, while No. 1 Western Red sold at Seattle at \$1.12 and No. 1 Hard Winter at \$1.13 per bushel. Fourteen per cent protein, Northern Spring from Montana was quoted at Seattle at \$1.24 per bushel in bulk. Export demand continued very dull although one cargo of White wheat was reported sold to the United Kingdom, and parcel sales totaling around 1500 tons were reported sold to Japan during the week at Portland. Export demand for flour was still negligible and no sales were reported during the week. Canadian wheat, which Hoover was apparently being given preference by European buyers. Stocks of wheat in Washington and Oregon country warehouses and elevators are relatively large. Trade reports indicate that about 45 per cent of last season's crop is still on farms or at country points, who farmers, offering slowly at current prices.

About Cherry Trees:

At the late Agricultural conference held in La Grande the committees on the fruit situation and conditions in Union county recommended the largest and earliest possible increase in our cherry production particularly and also in apples and berries, discouraging further planting of prunes and not considering pears.

In view of the above it should be expected that here in Union county where the records of the cherry are so very favorable to our thousands of acres of ideal cherry land, that enough people would make the utmost efforts to get out good size blocks of this fruit at once, as they should realize that every year that is lost into the future crops means several hundred dollars net profit per acre and as the limit advisable for us to obtain is so large that it will take years before we can even approach it, there is only one factor that should force us to procrastinate and postpone or delay planting a thousand acres almost immediately and this factor is the question of being able to secure sufficient reliable cherry trees from the nurseries.

Anyone who is contemplating planting cherry trees this spring should know that it is just as important to get reliable stock in good condition when buying trees, as when buying anything else, whether it is calves, pigs or what not. On account of the unusually severe cold last January in the Willamette Valley where most of the cherry trees are grown, there is a great deal of damaged trees in some localities down there; at Salem, where there are nearly a score of nurseries, they report the cherry trees unfit for planting, as the cambium layer of bark is badly injured and this reduces the available supply greatly; and a good deal of nursery stock was also damaged in different other localities, so that the intended planters should be very careful and see that they don't get trees that have a dark or discolored line in the bark next to the wood. And should also investigate the reliability of the nursery, so as to make certain of getting the varieties they want, and as good trees as possible because it might mean a difference of as much as one thousand dollars per acre in the net income for the first ten or twelve years whether one plants the best trees obtainable or the worst.
