NEW WAY TO PREPARE LAMB CHOPS

Addition of Novel Seasoning Improves Their Flavor

This new method really begins before the chops are put on the broiler or in the pan. First make a mixture of 3/4 teaspoonful salt, 1 teaspoonful sugar, 1 teaspoonful vinegar or lemon juice and 5 tablespoonfuls of salad oil. Pour this over the chops and let stand for a few minutes, then fry or broil them and you will be delighted with the way this seasoning heightens the flavor of the lamb.
