1930 Is "Test Year" in India And It Finds Gandhi as Chief Figure

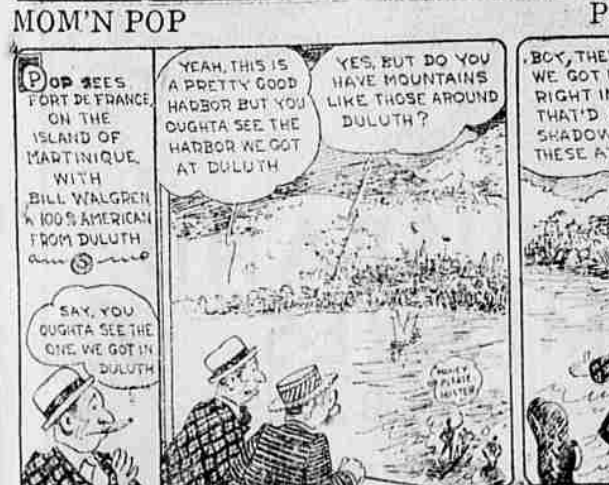

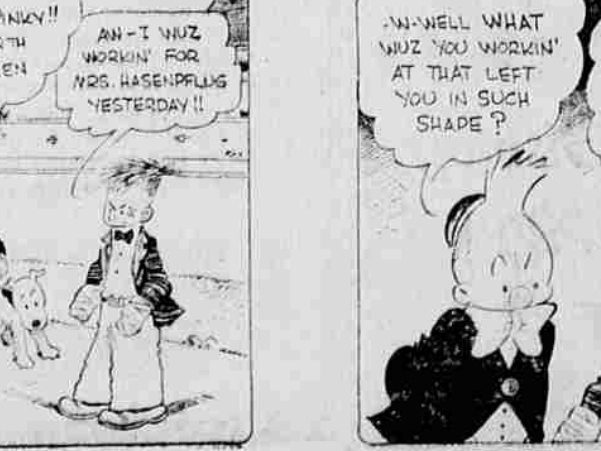

CHILD'S HOME TRAINING KEY TO SCHOOL ATTITUDE WASHINGTON (AP)—Home neglected children are responsible for the nervousness which some children feel toward school and its demands, in the opinion of Mrs. A. H. Reeve of Philadelphia, president of the International Federation of Home and School. CHILDREN are threatened at home with visits to the doctor and dentist if they don't behave," says Mrs. Reeve. "A fear of physical examinations in the school thus grows in them. "Many children, too, are forced into vocational work for which they are not fitted because the parents have a fond vision of the child as a professional type of some kind when he grows up." Mrs. Reeve is a member of President Hoover's school child committee working with the White House conference on child health and protection. Wild Turkeys in Black Hills CUREN, S. D. (AP)—Eighty-five pairs of wild turkeys from West Virginia, have been released in Custer state park here in an experiment which may lead eventually to stocking the whole of the Black hills.
