C. J. BREIER WILL LAUNCH STOCK DRIVE

Marking the inauguration of a drive for sale of stock in the C. J. Breier Co., which may lead to expansion of the chain of department stores to a total of 150 throughout the west, L. E. Weeks, of La Grande, has been appointed to represent Moser and Larson of Spokane in Eastern Oregon and Southern Idaho. Moser and Larson are financial agents for the Breier Co. and are handling the financing of the expansion program. Mr. Weeks will continue to make his headquarters in La Grande, but will cover all of Eastern Oregon and Southern Idaho, assisted by five or six salesmen.

Wheat Irregular At Finish Today

CHICAGO, Mar. 15 (AP)—Wheat prices showed rallying power in the late dealings today owing largely to reports that Kansas had failed to receive more than a few showers. A notable rally in corn values did much also to bring about recovery in the wheat market so that earlier losses were virtually offset. Receipts of corn in all markets were surprisingly light. Wheat closed irregular, ranging from 1/2 cent decline to 1/2 cent advance, compared with yesterday's trade. Corn closed 1 1/2 c up; oats 1 1/2 c higher and provisions 7-20c down.

Eggs And Butter Unchanged Today

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 15 (AP)—Eggs and butter prices were unchanged today, with eggs showing the weaker. Receipts have been in excess of the demand, but so far storage has taken care of the surplus. The fruit and vegetable situation was virtually stationary, with asparagus prices somewhat easier. The Pacific Fruit and Produce company reported it was expecting a carload of Roseburg broccoli.
