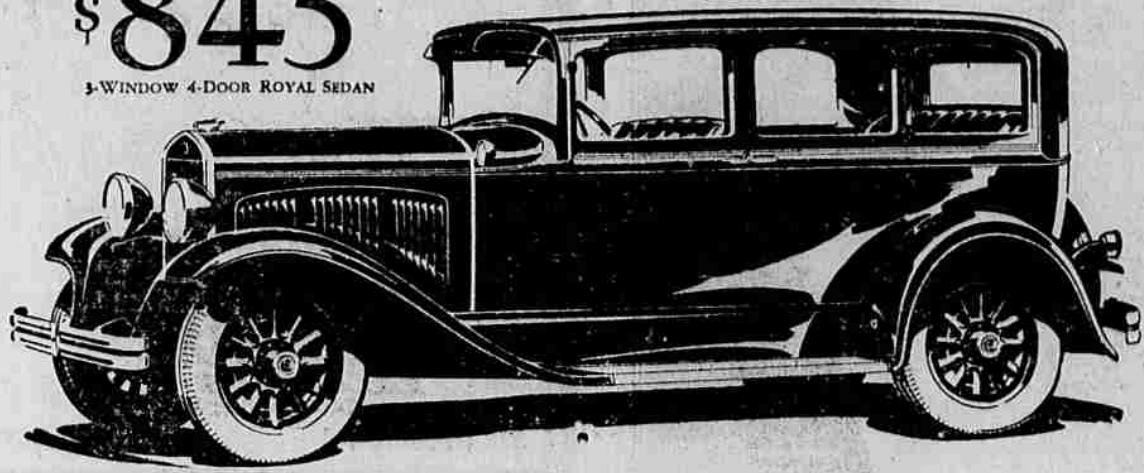

### Health Talks

**LITTLE BUT MIGHTY**  
Vitamins might be characterized as the most important substances in the body. They are essential to life and very fundamentally affect growth and normal function.

The history of vitamins begins about 1896 when an English scientist named Hopkins concluded that over and above the so-called fundamental elements of food, that is, carbohydrates (sugars and starches), proteins (animal and vegetable flesh foods), fats, and salts, there were certain other still unknown dietary factors required to sustain animal life.

He called these "accessory food factors."

Later a Dutch chemist discovered that a diet of polished rice when fed to fowls could produce a diseased condition in nerves, a so-called polyneuritis, which closely paralleled certain disease conditions observed in rice-eating populations.

Still later it was shown that if the husk-covering of rice were fed to bird or human polyneuritis sufferers, even in astonishingly small quantities, the condition could be cured.

These studies were carried further by a host of scientists, resulting ultimately in the demonstration of a number of vitamins designated as fat soluble A, water soluble B, water soluble C, vitamin D, vitamin E, and most recently vitamin PP.

Each of these vitamins appears to exercise a powerful influence over animal life. Their absence

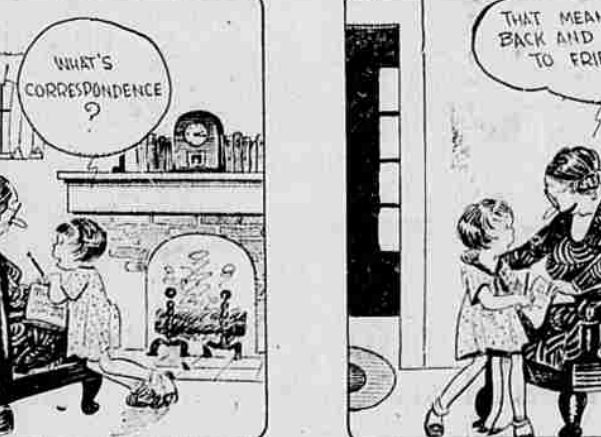
