The dinner table was beautiful, set with old blue willowware and orange cups and saucers which are known to be at least 200 years old and had belonged to Mr. Earney's parents in England.

Mrs. Earney came from Lanark, Scotland in 1866 and was seven weeks on the ocean coming over. In coming west, in this country, she walked part of the way from Wyoming, Nebraska to Salt Lake City.

Mr. Earney came from Southampton, England in 1864 and drove an ox team across the plains in America on his way to Salt Lake City. The journey westward occupied two months and 22 days. Mr. and Mrs. Earney were married on St. Patrick's day in 1867
