Menus Of The Day

- By Mrs. Alexander George BAKED HAM AND GRILLED SWEET POTATOES Breakfast Chilled Orange Juice Corn Meal Mush, browned Syrup Broiled Bacon Coffee Luncheon Baked Beans and Brown Bread Chili Sauce Tea Dinner Baked Ham and Grilled Sweet Potatoes Escalloped Cabbage Bread Plum Jam Head Lettuce and Russian Dressing Fruit-Pudding Cream Coffee Baked Ham and Grilled Sweet Potatoes 1 slice ham, 1 1/2 inches thick, 4 tablespoons flour, 1/2 cup vinegar, 1/2 cup water, 1/4 teaspoon powdered cloves, 3 sweet potatoes. Sprinkle the ham with the flour and fit into a baking pan. Add the vinegar, water and cloves. Cover and bake for 1 1/2 hours in a medium oven. Add the potatoes and bake for 45 minutes. Remove the potatoes and cook for 10 minutes directly under a fire. When the potatoes have browned on all sides, arrange around the ham which has been placed on a serving platter. Garnish with parsley and serve at once. Baked Brown Bread 1 1/2 cups flour, 1 cup graham flour, 1/2 cup corn meal, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons sugar, 2 teaspoons soda, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 cup molasses, 1 egg, 1 1/2 cups sour milk. Mix the ingredients and pour

into a greased loaf pan. Bake for 1 hour in a slow oven.

Fruit Pudding 1/2 cup sugar, 1-1/2 cup flour, 2 egg yolks, 2 cups milk, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup diced canned peaches, 1/2 cup diced pineapple, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract, 2 egg whites, stiffly beaten, 2 tablespoons confectioner's sugar, 1/2 cup diced marshmallows. Blend the sugar and flour. Add the egg yolks and milk. Cook in a double boiler until thick and creamy. Stir frequently to prevent lumping. Add the salt, peaches, pineapple, vanilla and lemon extract. Beat for 2 minutes. Cool. Beat the egg whites and add the sugar and marshmallows. Pour into the cooked mixture. Pour into a glass dish and chill. This is refreshing for spring serving.

Chats With Parents

FEEDING HIMSELF By Alice Judson Peale The intelligent young mother of today is frequently over-anxious to have her child acquire those habits of independence and self help of which she has read and heard so much.

One such mother said anxiously, "I don't know what's the matter with Teddy. He's two and he's not feeding himself yet and a two year old is supposed to be able to manage his cup and spoon. He just doesn't take the slightest interest in feeding himself and I'm wondering what's the matter with him."

There might, of course, be a good many reasons why Teddy does not feed himself. Perhaps he has been urged too much. Perhaps he has been made to go through the motions until he was over-tired and developed a resistance to the situation. Perhaps he enjoys the attention he gets when his mother feeds him.

But in any case the thing for mother to remember is that no two children are alike and that what one child learns at 16 months another may not learn until he is nearly three.

Generally speaking, it is true that a two year old should be able to feed himself but there are a good many normal children who have been subjected to no adverse learning situations who may yet not learn to do this until sometime later.

strated as of value in skin, bone, joint and gastro-intestinal tuberculosis. It is an effective preventive and curing agent in rickets. Light is of value in malaria and in the treatment of tetany due to a disturbance in the utilization of calcium in the body.

A number of skin diseases, including acne (pimpled skin) have been found amenable to light treatment.

Blood pressure, pulse and respiration are beneficially affected by judicious exposure to the sun, though, as illustrated by sun stroke and heat stroke, excess exposure may result in serious illness and even death.

MUMPS

In the spring and autumn, too, bumper crops of mumps appear. The disease is prevalent in most times, but becomes more widespread during the cooler months.

Mumps, or as it is known by its scientific name parotitis is caused by an as yet unknown agent, suspected to be of that infinitely small disease-causing bodies known as filterable viruses.
