Prep Meet Will Be Held May 10 At Corvallis

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis, Mar. 25—High schools of Oregon will soon receive entry blanks and instructions regarding the fourth annual Oregon state interscholastic track and field meet which will be held on the Oregon State college campus May 10.

More than 400 athletes from 35 high schools competed for honors in the meet last year and indications are that even more will take part this year.

Athletes to enter the meet will be required at least to equal the following times and distances: 100-yard dash, 11 seconds; 220-yard dash, 25 seconds; 220-yard low hurdles, 20 seconds; 120-yard high hurdles, 20 seconds; 44-yard run, 40 seconds; 88-yard run, 2 minutes, 10 seconds; mile run, 5 minutes, 30 seconds; 100 feet, 16 seconds; 200 feet, 34 seconds; 400 feet, 1:14; 800 feet, 3:10; 1,600 feet, 6:40; 3,200 feet, 13:20; 6,400 feet, 26:40; 12,800 feet, 53:20.
