Primo Carnera Beats Trafton In 54 Seconds

KANSAS CITY, Mar. 27 (AP)—Primo Carnera, giant Italian boxer, today defeated Alvin Trafton in as many appearances in America as boxing rings. The result of a 54 second victory here last night over George Trafton, erstwhile Chicago football professional.

The heavyweight match, scheduled for ten rounds, ended after Trafton fell to the canvas for the third time. The two fans present booed and jeered.

At the bell Trafton rushed across the ring at the towering Italian. After a half embrace he fell in the ropes on his stomach. At the count of six the ex-football player arose and again charged across the canvas. Carnera's big hand swung and again Trafton fell.

The foreman walked to his corner, placed his hands on the ropes, and gazed at the crowd. Trafton climbed to his feet at the count of nine, hurried across the ring, and raised his hands upward in the back.

Carnera then turned quickly and the Chicagoan fell for the count beneath a flurry of rights and lefts. A short right hand jab to the chin ended the fight.

The Italian weighed 271 pounds. His opponent 225.

As a result of last night's fight Carnera's gross earnings now are well above the \$100,000 mark. Nine of his matches have gone more than three rounds.

LEWIS BEATS FREDERICK

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 27 (AP)—John Fredrick, Swedish boxer, which wrestler temporarily lost his head and with it his match with Ed Lewis.

Lewis, world's heavyweight champion here last night, in the third and deciding fall, Fredrick had Lewis down and hit on his back. But Lewis of his own accord got to his feet and turned to acknowledge the tremendous applause of the crowd.

The crowd Lewis seized the opportunity, stood at Fredrick's legs and proceeded to hit him to the mat with an arm bar and cross-body punches for the deciding fall.
