## Wheat Held On First of March 95,950,000 Bu.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 29 (AP)—Wheat held in country mills and elevators March 1, was announced Friday by the department of agriculture as 95,950,000 bushels, compared with 82,419,000 bushels 2 year ago, and 75,428,000 bushels two years ago.
