

BUILDING DURING WEEK AT \$11,900

L. C. Smith Takes Out Permit for Structure — 1930 Total \$152,180.

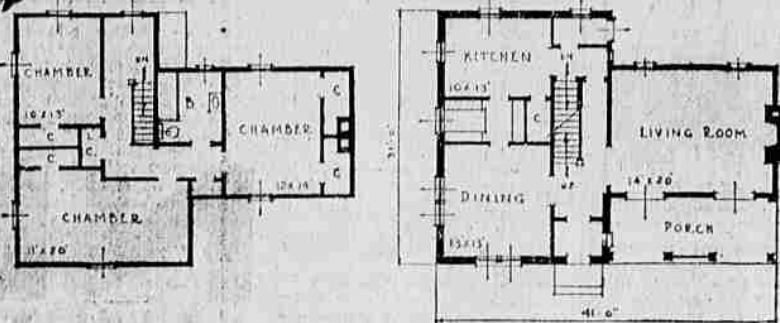
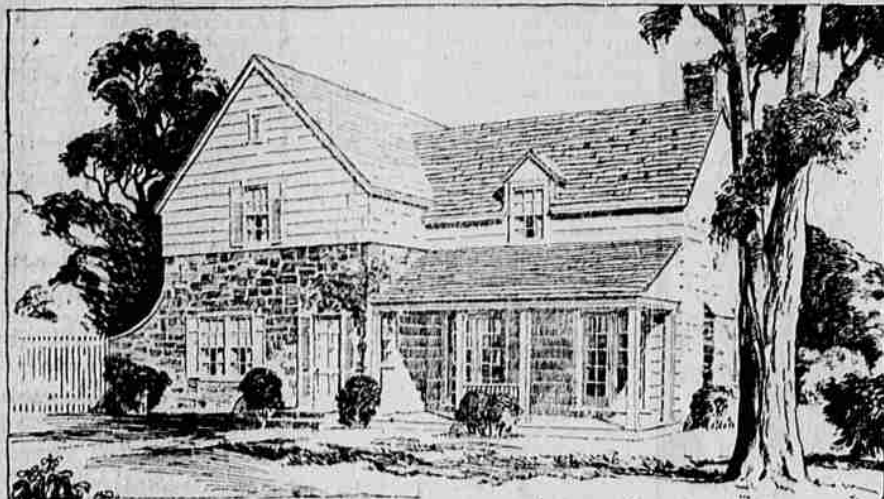
Opening the month with a push, new construction in this city for the first week of April amounted to \$11,900, bringing the running total for 1930 to \$152,180.

Only three permits were taken out last week, but none were less than \$1,500 and one, granted to L. C. Smith, amounted to \$9,900. This was taken out on Apr. 3 by L. P. Nielson to erect a two-story concrete business building on Washington avenue between Fifth and Sixth streets. Work has already started on this project.

On Apr. 1 a permit was given to J. D. Heidenreich to alter and repair his business building on Adams between Elm and Fir, which was damaged by fire earlier this year. The cost of repairing the place is estimated at \$1,500.

On Apr. 2 G. W. Dollow took out a permit to alter and repair a home on V between Spruce and Elm, the work to cost \$1,600. Ivan Wilson is the contractor.

THIS HOUSE IN STONE NEEDS BIG YARD



(By The Associated Press) A house that should be set back from the street is this design particularly suitable for the builder in a moderate-sized community.

It can be fitted nicely into a lot about 40 feet wide and 100 deep, allowing for a good-sized yard.

Spaciousness is a feature of all six rooms, none of which are characterized by crowdedness.

Gray stone and clapboards are

combined to make an attractive exterior, with the roof of vari-colored wood shingles. The clapboards on the upper exterior are painted white.

A dining alcove adds to convenience in the downstairs plan. Both the dining and living room face the street.

If the lot is sufficiently deep, plans also might include a separate garage in the rear of the house.

Under average labor and material costs, the expense of construction is estimated between \$10,000 and \$12,000, varying in different sections.

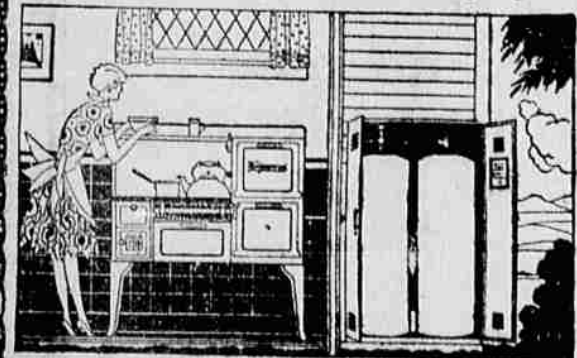
