prizes awarded for the various vocational contests and also for the state-wide Alpha Zeta essay contest. The entire program at this banquet will be broadcast from WOAC.

Finals in the state-wide public speaking contest will take place Thursday night. The state competition is part of a national contest sponsored by Senator Capper of Kansas through the Future Farmers of America, a nation-wide organization of boys in Smith-Hughes agriculture. This organization will hold its annual business meeting and elect officers while here.

Other features of the three-day program will include a tour of the campus, demonstrations by the different departments in the school of agriculture, basketball games between teams made up of the agriculture students from the different schools and attendance at a baseball game between Oregon State college and University of Oregon.

Details of the program are being worked out by Professor Hughes, assisted by Clyde Walker, assistant professor of agricultural engineering, and Donald Hill, assistant professor of farm crops. Working with this campus committee is a committee of high school teachers of agriculture consisting of Walter Leith, Newberg; Homer Grow, Roseburg; and Will Abrell, Cottage Grove.

This annual conference was begun in a small way five years ago but was considered of such benefit that it has developed into an official statewide event.
